

## This week's program: Muskegon Rotary's Environment Committee



Speakers: Pete DeBoer & Andrea Riegler

Rotary International (RI) is looking to invest in the environment and encouraged local clubs to get more involved and invested. With this new committee, they are looking at the goals with different perspectives, Pete with more of the environment side and Andrea with more of a sustainability view.

Rotary shares an interest in protecting our common legacy; the environment and RI has laid out three pillars:

-advancing ecological sustainability

-supporting activities that strengthen the conservation and

protection of natural resources -fostering harmony between communities and the environment.

Pete DeBoer, cochair of our club's new Environment Committee with a background from the West Michigan Land Conservancy, spoke about three larger projects from Rotary International that sparked more conversations within this new committee. These three projects were Operation Pollination from a Lansing club, Recycled Playgrounds from Australia, and Navajo Solar Lights from the four corners area of the US Southwest.



Andrea, co-chair of the committee and an architect with a history in the national parks system, says her interest and commitment in this committee "comes from a lot of different angles." She elaborated on one of her angles with a quote from Carl Elefante, "The greenest building is one that is already built." The link between approximately 23% of all content in the US landfills are from construction and demolition with 80% of that being from concrete and asphalt. Also, of that 23% in

the landfill, 90% of that is from demolition with 10% from construction.

One of the projects that fit the goals of this new committee through advancing ecological sustainability is the Marquette Mircroforest. The efforts of many Rotarians and Interactors will continue to support with the help of this new committee. The goal of the committee is not to re-invent the wheel but to lean on the other organizations that have the same goals. One of those groups is the West Michigan Shoreline Redevelopment Commission who supported the "Kinder-gardeners" at the microforest.

Pete and Andrea are looking for more members to add to their committee and hope this inspired you.

### Sunday Funday at Muskegon Luge Adventure Sports Park






### **Ep 35: Consumers Energy Solar Project**


# Tour of Adelaide Pointe Sept. 4, 2024
