MUSKEGONCITY PUBLIC ART INITIATIVE

Judy Hayner, Project Director Muskegon City Public Art Initiative Project of Community Foundation of Muskegon County

Former Muskegon Museum of Art Director **Judy Hayner** thought retirement might mean slowing down a bit. She couldn't have been more wrong, and we couldn't be more grateful!

The Muskegon City Public Art Initiative Project to date has four dozen major works of public art throughout our urban center.

These pieces help define Muskegon and define us. It becomes part of who we are.

"What makes Muskegon really unique--it's not the lake and the beaches-- everybody doesn't have that combination of things we have in Muskegon, the amazing infrastructure of art and culture."

Charles Hackley was inspired by Andrew Carnegie's charge to wealthy men to spend their money improving their communities. He was interested in public art. The very first work was the Soldiers and Sailors Monument in Hackley Park placed in 1892.



Following was the McKinley statue in front of the Hackley Administration Building in 1902. It was the first tribute to William McKinley after his assassination.


Formed in 2005 by Pat Johnson, the Downtown Arts Committee was part in parcel of trying to figure out how to reimagine and redefine our downtown. Pat put together a group to figure out where does art fit into that mix. Henry Matthews, former Director of the Museum, invited community artists to advise the Community Foundation to look at where could we put art.



Patrick O'Leary, CFO for Sealed Power, lived in Muskegon for five years. He no longer lives here, but his heart has never left. He had the idea to see and support another 10 significant works of permanent public art in our community.



So far there have been three completed including Moxie the Mastodon and the City Built on Timber at Heritage Landing. The third will be at the roundabout at Pere Marquette.



Patrionicity has now raised \$50K which will also be matched.

The first big project the Public Art Initiative worked on was with a Chicago sculptor, Richard Hunt. His sculpture in the downtown roundabout is one of his very best works.

Coming up, **Jerry Wiersma** has worked with the railroad companies allowing us to commission art for the railroad murals.

The Symphony Project is heading toward an August installation at seven different sites downtown and 31 musical instruments, the largest of this kind anywhere.

We're very lucky to have the tradition of all of the arts. When you think about what makes Muskegon really unique, it's not just the lake and the beaches. What everybody doesn't have is that combination of things we have in Muskegon. An amazing infrastructure of art and culture (and remarkable generous people who care). And best of all - public art is free to all!

The Downtown Arts Committee has worked on a map developed by the Tom Van Bruggen and the County of Muskegon GIS. On this site is detailed information on most of the works Judy discussed today. Use this handy map to plan your driving/biking/walking tour of Muskegon.
