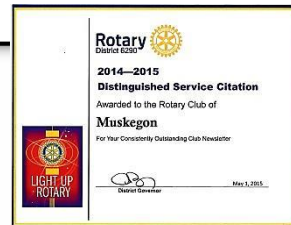

As the father of two daughters, I couldn't be more impressed by the 32 young women who joined us at Rotary this Thursday. Representing communities from all over the State of Michigan, these young women, ranging from 19 to 25 years old, are empowering women everywhere to develop the confidence they need to achieve their personal best.



Miss America originated in 1921 as a "bathing beauty revue", however the contest is now judged on competitors' talent performances and interviews. As of this year, there is no longer a swimsuit portion to the contest, nor consideration of physical appearance.



Both the Miss America and Miss Michigan competitions imbue these women with confidence, and with confidence comes the power to make real change for good.

This opportunity for change goes beyond one's community; the Miss Michigan 2018 winner will also earn the chance to compete at the Miss America pageant in Atlantic City, N.J. in September, bringing their activism to the national stage.

For their short time with us on Thursday, these contestants introduced themselves and several performed their talents for our large Rotary audience. Among the performances were beautiful singing and spoken word poetry which was received by our audience with enthusiasm and thunderous applause.



Although there can be only one Miss Michigan 2018, all of these young women deserve our admiration and support for their drive to make a positive impact around the world. As far as I'm concerned, they are all winners.

WHEN AND WHERE?

The 2018 Miss Michigan pageant begins with preliminary rounds at 7 p.m. on Thursday, June 14, and Friday, June 15. The finals followed by the crowning are scheduled for 7 p.m. on Saturday, June 16. The event will take place at the Frauenthal Center, 425 W. Western Ave., in downtown Muskegon.

Miss Michigan contestants receive substantial scholarship money, including \$12,000 to the winner, \$5,000 to the runner-up, \$4,000 to second runner-up, \$3,000 to third runner-up and \$2,000 to fourth runner-up.
