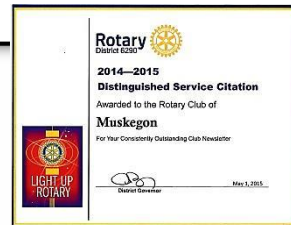

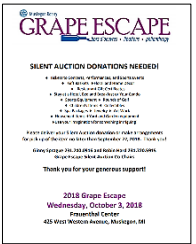

Last Week's Program **OUR DISTRICT** **6290 GOVERNOR**

District Governor Brian Robertson began his presentation with the new vision statement adopted a year ago by the Rotary International Board of



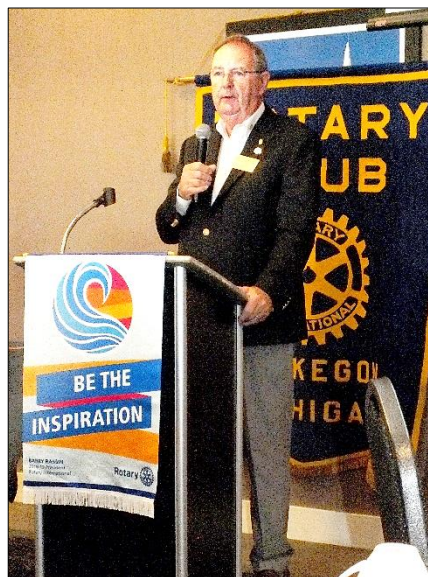
Directors. "Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change - across the globe, in

our communities, and in ourselves." We unite because we must believe in the **power** that we have to make positive change in the world as an organization. We must take care of our organization and members. Robertson shared that as he traveled to all of the Rotary meetings in District 6290 that he needed to "Be the Inspiration" but that he gets the inspiration from visiting the clubs.

DG Robertson discussed the Global Peace Index, which ranks the nations of the world by their level of peacefulness. The index gauges global peace using three broad themes: *the level of safety and security in society*, *the extent of domestic and international conflict* and *the degree of militarization*. The goal is to provide concrete interventions for peace and be overall more peaceful societies, which has not been the case in our world over the last few years. It is important as Rotary clubs for us to take

a role and utilize resources to build a more peaceful world. As the world's leading foundation, the Rotary International Foundation utilizes less than 9% of funds to cover administrative costs, funds donated to the RI Foundation are focused directly on causes. The foundation focuses on projects that will be sustainable well beyond the funding provided from Rotary. The governor also wanted to clarify that the goal each year is to have each member of a club donate \$100. This is not a requirement but he asks each one of us to give based on the achievements of the foundation.

Rotary began the largest health initiative- eradicating polio- since 1979. To date, polio cases have been reduced by 99.9% worldwide with only 3 countries still reporting outbreaks. Nigeria has completed 2 years without an outbreak and polio will be considered eradicated once 3 full documented years is achieved. Pakistan and Afghanistan are two remaining countries that have had 14 cases total documented this year. Through the work of the End Polio initiative, infrastructure is in place to manage cases if polio was to reemerge.



The Elk Rapids Rotary club raised over \$43,000 for End Polio by convincing people to jump out of an airplane. **Jim Fisher** shared that around \$20,000 was raised from the Roger Andersen event earlier this month and half of funds will be going to support End Polio. Funds raised for this initiative are two-for-one matched by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation which allows for even greater financial impact of \$30,000 from our Club.



Thank you to DG Robertson and wife Leona for joining our meeting and inspiring each member to continue to make a difference here and around the world!

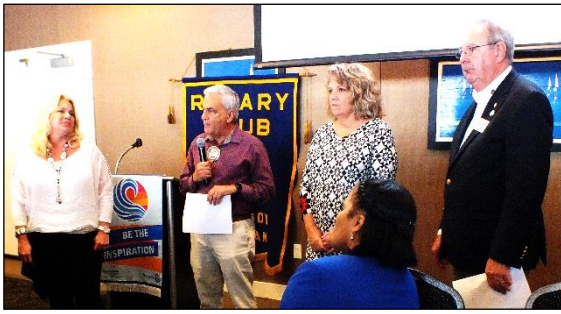
