Thanks to a lot of hard work and very generous donors, work is continuing on USCGC McLane with the goal of having her ready to attend the 2017 Grand Haven Coast Guard Festival for her 90th birthday! The winter was spent refurbishing the enlisted/ berthing area. The port side and the forward bulkhead of the compartment, the exterior wall from the Chief's quarters, and the wall dividing the enlisted from Officers' Country are done. This only leaves the starboard side,



behind the bunks and the deck to be refurbished. This month the plan is to remove



any and all loose paint and/or non-skid from the deck. The deck will then be primed and repainted including anything physically attached to the deck, i.e. bits, cleats, pad eyes, and the torpedo racks. If anyone is willing to make a donation for a specific area, that would be greatly appreciated and recognition of that would be noted in that area.
