#### Mitchell's Account of Rotary Club of Melbourne Park

On Tuesday night, Mitchell attended the Rotary Club of Melbourne Park. Really friendly atmosphere, great food - pity he couldn't try out the wine due to driving commitments. Club was set up around one table, was like a big board of directors meeting - everyone could speak openly, no microphones or "formality". There was an agenda which everyone had on their laptops or hard-copy. Meeting lasted just under 1 hour.

Guest Speaker was a member of the MACE biking club. MACE stands for Motorcyclists Advocating Child Empowerment. They are a not-for-profit organisation that helps and protects children who have been abused, physically and mentally. It was noted many times in the discussion that they are not an outlaw group. Many members in the club enjoy knitting, and they don't always catch up for a beer but rather high-tea. Tiny, who was anything but, was the presenter and spoke extremely well. They are only small, but they are mighty in what they are achieving. Tiny mentioned that both himself and members of the club are targeted by Police due to the biker image, however once they tell them what they are about police are usually on their side - he agreed that police should rightly so be curious of bikers and their movements, and if getting pulled up a couple of times a week saves and empowers children than he can live with that.

Club discussions around the table were about fundraising. The club is doing an acceptable amount, however like all clubs they feel they can do better - mostly they were coming up with ideas on how to source funding, they have many Melbourne business people in the room with helpful connections. The club currently has 48 members, and there were 3 guests in the room. The president-elect of the club mentioned that they are a satellite club, as the original club has a lack of adaption to changing circumstances, she coined the phrase "because that's how it had always been done, they believed it was how it should alway been done", it seemed tradition was in charge of the clubs success, not the efforts of its members. The have gone from 8 members to 48 in just over 5 years.
