GUEST SPEAKER MARYANNE MARTIN

Maryanne's presentation covered her research on Macarthur during the 1st World War, and including several of the locals who were conscripted, and what life was like in Macarthur at that time.

Maryanne completed a similar exercise for Condah, and was successful in obtaining a \$5500 grant from DVA, through the Macarthur RSL, to research Macarthur and make a film of her findings. Two stories from the research involved were Cecil Twist and the Bunworth Brothers.

Cecil was an illegitimate child from a Catholic family, who grew up in Macarthur and fathered a child before he enlisted in the army. He served in Egypt, enjoyed his off-duty leave periods, married an English lady, and his mother was devastated when she was advised that he had been killed in action in France.

The Bunworth Bros., Frank and Michael, enlisted together.

Michael was killed in action in August 1918, and Frank was killed in June of the same year, and it was reported that Frank had been buried by the enemy. Michael's possessions were returned to his family in Macarthur, and included a watch which he had removed from a deceased German soldier. The family is still attempting to return the watch to his family.
