- Lorraine Wilson and Rose Howard reported on the 2017 Conference. Rose was
 very impressed with Kim Ledger (father of actor Heath) who talked about the

GUEST SPEAKER

Kevin introduced Ian O'Connell, kelpie (not 'dog') trainer extraordinaire! He was born in Casterton, boarded at Monivae, and initially was a shearer and contractor.

He accumulated 1200 acres of land in marginal country then went to Mill Rd to live. Training kelpies starts with nurturing their basic instincts of rounding up, bringing the "kill" to you, and being praised for all the good things they do. A pup of 1 year old is the equivalent of a 7yo child, so when in training, the pup is only given tasks that it can understand, for its mental age.

lan had a chart he goes by, showing us the steps he takes in training a kelpie, and the harder tasks, like paddock work, are not given to the animal until it is around 2 years old. The dog won't be fully trained until it is 3. His chart shows the 12 levels of training required. He only requires 5 minutes, twice a day per dog.

lan ran the Australian Kelpie Muster for 7 years, and when he finished that, he started his dog trialing, dog schools, and judging all over Australia. A good trained up Kelpie will sell for \$20,000. Ian maintains that most farmers have no idea what they are doing, and try to make their pups work far too early. Ian trains them through positive words, pitch of voice, actions that don't scare the pup...work with the head and eyes, rather than feet and hands.

He also loves to go bike riding and running, from which he has gone on to run marathons. A most impressive and dedicated person with much energy to burn, either on the bike, or on the track.
