Helping JPs to be readily available

HAVE you ever wondered where to find a Justice of the Peace in Southern Grampians? Wonder no more.

There are JPs in your area, however they may not always be available.

To alleviate this problem, Hamilton based JPs operate a free 'Document Signing Centre'.

The centre covers a range of legal requirements, such as witnessing affidavits, sworn statements, statutory declarations or certifying copies of original documents including witnessing or certifying copies of enduring powers of attorney.

Some clients need documents witnessed to present in a court of law and they often leave it to the last minute just before the court is in session.

If they avail themselves of the Signing Centre service, they can have the documents witnessed at a time convenient to them well before the court date occurs.

The service operates from a private function room at the rear of the Hamilton Library where privacy and confidentiality is assured.

All documents need to be prepared prior to presentation, as the JP is not able to assist with compiling the document.

The JP role is to witness the signing of documents or certifying copies of original documents which must be produced.

Legal advice is not offered

The service is based at the Hamilton Library and offers a two hour attendance by a JP.

Available times and days are: Tuesdays 10am - 12pm and Thursdays 2pm - 4pm, public holidays excluded.

Appointments are not necessary.

The Signing Centre has links to the Royal Victorian Association of Honorary Justices and the Department of Justice and is sponsored as a Community Project by the Rotary Club of Hamilton and Southern Grampians Shire Council.
