Foundation- Noel – Marguerite Barankitse (from Burindi, Africa) has been awarded the first Aurora Prize for Awakening Humanity. During the Civil War in Burindi, 20 years ago, she turned a Catholic Diocese into a refuge for children caught up in the conflict, regardless of whether they were Tutsi or Hutu. After the war, she opened a hospital for both ethnic groups, and it has treated 80,000 patients. She plans to use the \$1million prize to send the children of East Africa to school.

DG RAY HERBERT’S ADDRESS.

- DG Ray said that the Hamilton Rotary Club, even though it doesn’t have large numbers, is meeting the needs of the Community. He said we have some very worthwhile projects – Sheepvention, the Police Community Award, Dunkeld Races and the Document Signing Centre.
- He quoted IP Ian Risely as saying: “Together we can do more”, and we are showing that we can do it as a team of not only Rotarians, but with the aid of other groups like the Scouts and Schools, and we work together with the Council and JPs.
- Some of our members have been to Fiji and Timor Leste, to do helpful work over there.
- On the 22nd of April, it is World Earth Day, and RI would like each Rotarian to plant a tree on this day. This will mean that there will be millions of trees planted, and the world will be a better place for it.
- Rotary Youth Exchange has played a great part in forming a huge network of students.
- The GSE now has a new name – Vocational Training Team. The team consists of people of the same occupation, instead of several different ones.
- \$90,000 went to a Peace Scholarship, and it was awarded to a Rwandan lady, who used it to go to a Qld College.
- Deidre’s project is “End Trachoma 2020” and all monies given by clubs will go towards ending this terrible eye disease.
- The Rotary Club of Melbourne will be 100 in 2021.
