VOCATIONAL VISIT TO LAURIE & MOLLY HERRMANN'S PLACE.

After we had a lovely social get together in Kevin and Carolyn Safe's beautiful garden, we all wandered up to Molly's to see Laurie's amazing collection of shearing memorabilia.

Laurie Herrmann was involved in the shearing industry for about 66 years. Laurie and Molly obtained a property from the Crown abutting the Grampians National Park north of Cavendish after they were married. After establishing a home and clearing the land he commenced shearing to support his income. Laurie was known for the care of the sheep, equipment, and work mates he showed in the shearing shed. His involvement in the shearing industry encouraged him to collect old equipment, and restore if necessary, over many decades. His focus was on preserving the history of the wool industry. Laurie was renowned for hand shearing and was invited to be part of the historic 'Shearing the Rams' painting by Tom Roberts. This event was held at the North Tuppal woolshed near Tocumwal

Involving 78 blade shearers. At age 84 Laurie was a highlight as the oldest shearer in the crew. Laurie passed away at age 88.

The Laurie Herrmann shearing equipment is housed in McPherson Street and Molly Herrmann hosted our group, explaining the various pieces that make up the exhibition. It was an amazing collection. We had a lovely evening, and thank Molly for being such a gracious hostess. She was able to answer all our questions, which made our evening all the more interesting.
