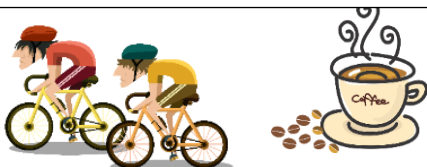



WHAT DOES THE ROTARY WHEEL MEAN?

THE KEY OR SLOT
Represents the President of the Rotary Club

THE CENTRAL AXIS
It represents the members of the clubs who, together with the key, which symbolizes the president of the club, are in charge of generating the necessary energy to set the functional rotary gear in motion.

THE WHEEL
The rotary wheel symbolizes the universality of Rotary, in a demonstration of its internationality and global reach.

THE 24 TEETH
They represent the 24 hours a day that each Rotarian has to enjoy, live and share with friendship and fellowship the ideal of Rotary Service.

THE SIX RAYS
symbolize in this order:
1) the family
2) action
3) friendship
4) professional ethics and the principle of qualification
5) religion (freedom of worship)
6) institutionally aimed at maintaining the integration of the Rotarian

COLORS
The gold color evokes the nobility of the blue color represents the firmament, indicating the universality and elevation of Rotary purposes
