Guest Speaker

Arthur Graham- North Victoria Domestic Violence Housing Project
(Introduced by John Main)

Arthur has been a member of the Swan Hill Rotary Club for 35 years. He is a Financial Planner and involved in Meals on Wheels.

He was astounded at the domestic violence figures from his region. Swan Hill is located between Bendigo and Mildura, and this is where most Domestic Violence Housing is located.

The project is involving many local organizations including Rotary, Lions, Inner Wheel, and the Masonic Lodge. A committee has been formed to raise \$3million to enable housing to be built in Swan Hill and Kerang.

The money will be used to establish purpose-built accommodation for women and children who need to leave the family home. It will be a safe and secure environment and managed by the local agencies.

The project is being launched on the 12th November with publicity that it hopes will encourage other organizations to come onboard.



Family violence is violence between family members, such as between parents and children, siblings, and intimate partners.

Domestic violence is a type of family violence that occurs specifically between current or former intimate partners.

Both family violence and domestic violence include various behaviours:

physical violence (hitting, choking, use of weapons)

emotional abuse, also known as psychological abuse (intimidating, humiliating)

coercive control (controlling access to finances, monitoring movements, isolating from friends and family).

Some statistics

- 1 in 6 women have experienced physical or sexual violence by a current or former partner, while for men it is 1 in 16
- On average, 1 woman a week and 1 man a month is killed by a current or former partner.4
- 1 in 3 clients (29% or about 82,300 clients) seeking assistance from homelessness services stated domestic and family violence was the most common main reason identified for seeking help.
- 41% (or 119,200) of people seeking help from specialist homelessness services in 2019-20 had experienced domestic and family violence.6

Polio: So Far So Good, So

Close was both a celebration and a revelation for Rotarians & friends this World Polio Day. It looked at how far Rotary has come with PolioPlus/End Polio Now, past present & future plus focus on the Late Effects of Polio impacting so many polio survivors today.

This event talked to experts such as **Associate Professor Robert Booy** at Sydney University, an Infectious Diseases Expert, **Rotarian Ann Lee Hussey** from the US, **Rotarian Ramesh Ferris** - Canada, **Rotary Ambassador and polio survivor and BBC Travel Presenter**

Ade Adepitan from the UK, who was a Keynote Speaker at the Rotary International Convention in Sydney in 2014, **Michael Jackson** - Polio Australia's Clinical Health Educator, **Rotarian Bob Aitken** from RI in Parramatta and some polio survivors to increase awareness on World Polio Day. The webinar paid tribute to the architect of the PolioPlus program, the late Sir Clem Renouf.
