- Soup is organized.
- The butcher in the Hub has been very helpful, supplying burgers, sausages, steaks, onions, oil, and chips. These will be delivered.
- Wayne Donehue with family and staff erected the shed.
- Several people are required tomorrow to unload soft drinks etc. at 10am.
- Chip cooker needed upgraded gas lines and regulator, but this was done speedily by Finchetts.
- Food handling certificates are recommended but not mandatory.
- Gloves only need to be worn if handling cooked food directly.
- Money handlers should not handle food.
- Gravy will be available to go on chips if requested.
- Soup and gravy pots should not be topped up.
- Temperature checking needs only to be done once per shift (about 3 times daily).
- Covid plan not mandatory.
- Masks will be available.
