Bob Cadden discussed the financial review presented to the board by Glenn Howell.

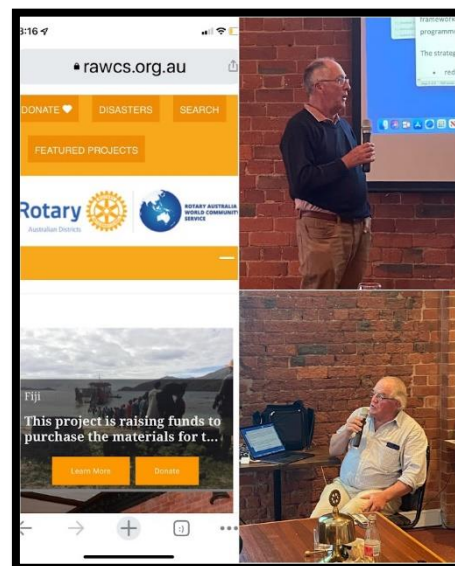
The board have considered the report and have recommended two amendments to be presented to the Annual General Meeting to be held on 2nd November 2022.

Guest Speaker Noel Howard RAWCS District Chairperson

Chairperson Murray Menzel introduced Noel Howard who is District Chairman of RAWCS. Noel advised that the district has eight projects currently in progress.

These projects include,

- Housing pods Northern Rivers NSW flood victims which cost \$30,000 each.
- Project goal is \$500,000
- PNG Lese Oalai school development for 560 children. Project goal \$500,000
- Northern Victoria Domestic Violence Housing Project. Project goal \$3million
- Timor Leste Repair to health clinic at Klibur Domain.
- Tonga Dental Health Project which includes library and training rooms. Project goal \$100,000
- WHO Malaria Report
241 million cases in 2020 with 627,000 deaths,
Proposed actions include cleaning up waterways to reduce mosquito population and supply mosquito proof bed nets. WHO Plan is to reduce infections by 90% by 2030.

President James thanked Noel for his presentation and great work with RAWCS then closed
