ROTARY CLUB OF HORSHAM EASTPRESIDENT'S REPORT1976-77

"I Believe in Rotary-Service" was Robert Manchester's theme for his year as President of Rotary International. The Rotary Club of Horsham East fulfilled this theme by dedicating itself to the raising of "117,000 for the Karkana Day Training Centre.

Although this appeal was launched during Rotarian John Heid's year as President, the Horsham East Rotarians continued with unflagging enthusiasm into my year as President to see this project completed. Whilst all members wholeheartedly supported this worthy cause, I feel I cannot let this opportunity pass without special mention of three rotarians; Immediate Past President John Heid, Past President Reece Burgess and former Rotarian Murray Degan.

The Karkana Building Appeal was our major effort for the year but there were also several other projects conducted -

1. Erection of seventeen chains of fencing at the Karkana Building site.
2. Selling soft drinks and ice creams at the Horsham Show, involving rotarians and rotarians wives.
3. The chicken manure bagging day in conjunction with the Horsham Rotaract Club. This must go down in Club history as one of the dirtiest projects undertaken, but it was also a day of good fellowship between rotarians and rotaractors.
4. The fourth Arts and Crafts Show, which was again a financial success. Special thanks to Rotarians Tony Peart, Lou Richardson and all other rotarians actively involved.
5. The formation of the Wimmera Amateur Radio and Electronics Club which was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Horsham East.
6. The induction of seven new members into the Rotary Club of Horsham East. Due to transfers and resignations we showed a gain of only three members. We commenced the year with 48 members and finished with 51.
7. The successful completion of Hideoaki Mikabe's year as an exchange student and the selection and placing of Dianne Pearson to Japan.

One of the highlights of my year was the selection of Rotarian Bill Over to lead the Group Study Exchange team to Sweden.

Contrary to unfounded criticism from one section of the community, Cec. Hopper and his committee are to be congratulated on their activities at our area of the River Beautification Scheme and their efforts to improve on some work.

I wish to thank all members of the Rotary Club of Horsham East for their support and loyalty throughout my year of Presidency. It has been a rewarding and unforgettable experience.

In conclusion I would also like to thank my wife Val for her help and the ladies of Rotary for their assistance whenever called upon. A special thank you to Margaret Richardson for the beautiful and varied floral decorations on the tables at our social functions.

With the heavy commitment of the Club to the Karkana Building Appeal activities in the area of assisting Handicapped Children were centred on this appeal. And what a success we achieved! In the last month we have forwarded a questionnaire to local schools seeking their advice on how we can best assist Horsham's handicapped children in the future.

Club members organised Horsham's collecting for the Royal Children's Hospital Appeal, again with outstanding success. Although donations were not read over the air for the first time, the sum of £4000 raised was comparable to last year. Thanks to Rtn. Dug. Weir for providing the facilities to receive telephone calls and donations, and to the club members who manned the telephones.

Thank you to all club members who have contributed time, money and effort to serving our community's young people in capacities both within and without our club's Youth Activities Committee structure.

Planning the 1976-77 Rotary East year.

We commenced the year by asking all the members of Community Service to try and be involved in as many service activities as practical in the City and District. It was found that we were involved in over twenty-two services by our eleven members.

Topping this, our own Rotary East effort for this year was planned and added to as follows:-

1. Usual Meals on Wheels
2. Karkana Rural-Urban scrap metal drive
3. Stage 3 of river beautification
4. Planning new design for Veta Landt
5. Aid to Christmas festivities
6. Arts and Crafts; Number one Club effort
7. Approach to businesses regarding apprenticeships
8. Karkana - seventeen chain of first class fencing by all members as a number two Club effort.
9. Soft drink selling at the Show as number three Club effort
10. The latest effort for the year was a well thought of plan in which the High School students assisted a community program of help to the elderly in the way of cooking and gardening.
Also a group of over forty students invaded the Rotary East river section and cleaned up rubbish, dug around trees, cut around the footpath at the fountain.

We, the Community Service members, feel that this program would help greatly in the students realising the work that has been done in a community and may off-set VANDALISM, by their knowledge of the hours spent by the City Council and Service Clubs of any town or city.

11. Since the commencement of the new year we have been completing our Karkana effort with the collecting of batteries that were delivered to Tom to dispose of.

Tom and Greg. are working hand-in-glove in an attempt to improve the Veta Landt fountain. Rain has stopped this project for the time being but pags have been placed in the area for the garden setting. Murray Mimie is varing to pull down the stone work.

The river frontage is going to be graded so as to allow the cutting implements to do their job without damage to the cutters.

Future planning is to gravel the barbeque area for the car space only and we also desire a log cabin type of toilet block for that area.

Each member of our Committee has had a job detailed to him and each job has been carried out well considering the other organised clubs they attend.

"KARKANA" BUILDING APPEAL
APPEAL COMMITTEE REPORT

As the Appeal entered the second half of the year set aside to raise \$100,000 as the local contribution to build a training centre for intellectually handicap persons, \$60,000 had been raised.

The Committee realized the mammoth task ahead of it to raise the remaining \$40,000, however under the outstanding leadership of P.P. Reece Burgess continued the task with zeal and dedication.

Its enthusiasm and application was rewarded to result in a gross amount in excess of \$120,000 being raised.

THE NETT AMOUNT NOW AVAILABLE IS AT PRESENT -

\$114,660

and it is still growing.

With the Government grant this means that a Centre to cost in total some \$600,000 can be built.

Major donations to the Appeal were Mr and Mrs J Schier \$12,000, Buckland Foundation \$8,000, Hawkins Estate \$8,000, Horsham Apex Club \$5,500, Vulcan Aust. Ltd \$5,000.

Even so such success would not have been possible without the support of all Service Clubs, Schools and Churches, Women's Auxiliaries and most of all the people of Horsham and District.

All Rotarians and their families contributed to this effort. Besides our Chairman P.P. Reece Burgess two others merit special recognition - Treasurer ex-Rotarian Murray Degnan and Secretary Mrs Patsy Castleman. Their example enthused others and is reflected in the magnificent result.

Negotiations are now proceeding with Architect Wm. Smart and the Mental Deficiency Training Service to plan and develop the Training Centre.

Arising from meetings in Melbourne progress is now reaching the stage where detailed plans and specifications are about to be prepared for submission to the Mental Deficiency Training Service for approval.

This is in accordance with the overall programme for development of the Centre to invite tenders late in 1977 with the building to commence early in 1978 and the Centre completion in mid 1978.

established the Rotary Club
