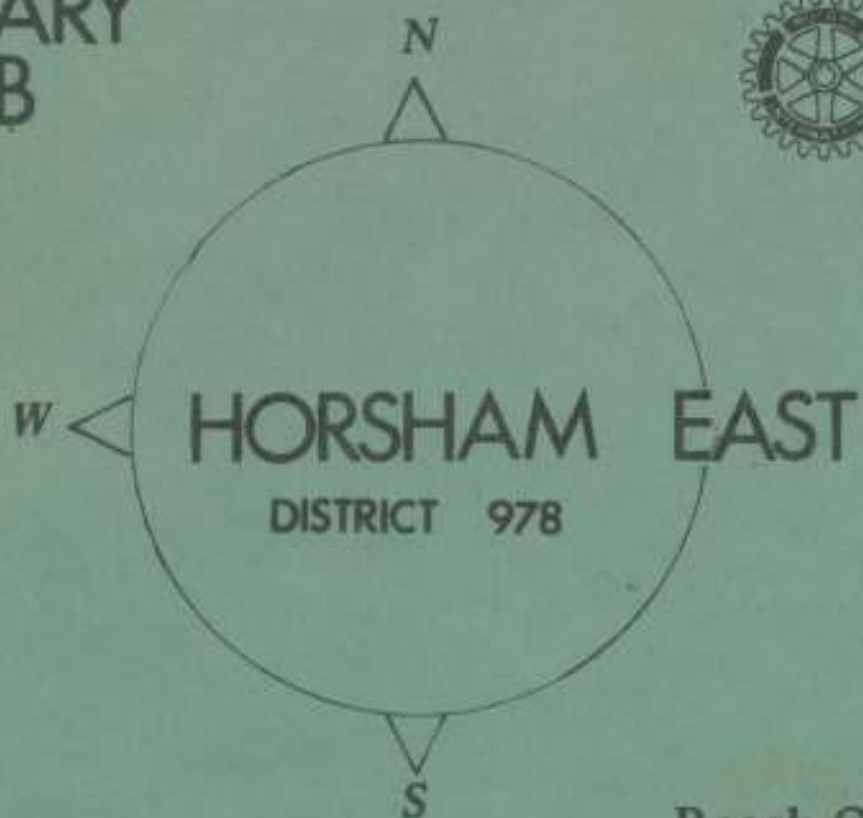

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1978-79

Although this time of the year marks the end of a Rotary year, it also is the beginning of a new year. With all clubs, whether they be Rotary Clubs, other Service Clubs or organisations, there is always a feeling of expectation, excitement and enthusiasm when a new "team" takes over the leadership. This change heralds new ideas, new programmes and of course, that vital spark of energy that every Rotary Club needs.

It is therefore up to each member of this Club to pick up the enthusiasm of our incoming President Alan Uebergang and his Committee, and see that 1979-80 is another year of growth for Horsham East Rotary.

I pledge my wholehearted support to Alan and his Committee, and congratulate them on their appointments. Janet and I trust that Alan and Lorna, together with all Rotarians and their Ladies, have a rewarding and enjoyable year together.

It is often difficult for a President to gauge the "feeling" of a Club from the official table, where he spends so much time each week. However, in attempting to move amongst the members at each meeting, I have gained the strong impression that we have become a very close knit group, with good fellowship and preparedness to co-operate with each other. All Committees have achieved worthwhile results to programmes during the year details of which you will find in the Individual Director's reports.

Like all Clubs, we have been sorry to lose members through the year by transfer, and resignation, however we have gained some excellent new members, who I am sure will contribute greatly to Rotary Service in the coming years. Our actual membership has not grown in numbers during this year, however we have an excellent base on which to build.

The theme of Rotary International this last year has been "Reach Out", when our Australian World President Clem Renout asked each Rotarian to give that little bit extra of himself to "Reach Out" in service.

Clem requested Rotarians to "Reach Out" across a desk, in their vocation. Each Rotarian must now ask himself, has he made that extra effort? Clem also requested us to "Reach Out". Across a room, in fellowship. My observation has been that this has been done; that opportunities have been shared with guests and visiting Rotarians at meetings, on working bees, and whenever we have been engaged in Service among the public of Horsham.

"Reach Out" Across a street, was the next request, and here I would refer you to the report of our Youth Activities and Community Service Directors, which illustrate our attempts in this regard.

Most importantly of all we were asked to "Reach Out" across International barriers to recognise the true International nature of Rotary. This year has been an excellent year in International Service. We have been able to contribute to the RI 75th Anniversary fund at the rate of \$15.00 per member. This money will assist in funding the 3H programme (Health, Hunger and Humanity) whereby Rotary International will carry out a major project in a developing country.

Other International projects have included financial support to both Club and District programmes in other countries.

We have been most fortunate in having our Sponsored Group Study Exchange Awardee Bruce Valpied away in Canada and U.S.A. for 6 weeks during the last few months. Bruce has been an outstanding member of our District Team and has assisted Horsham East Rotary Club to promote International Goodwill and Understanding.

At present, through our Youth Activities Committee, we are privileged to be hosting an exchange student from Japan. Yoko Metoki is proving herself to be an outstanding ambassador for her country, as well as for her sponsoring club. Those who have met her have been charmed by her personality and maturity. Thankyou Yoko for being such a lovely guest, and assisting us to know something more of your country.

Earlier this year we farewelled our exchange student from U.S.A., Donna Bird, who contributed so much during her year with us.

In conclusion, may I sincerely thank all Directors for their wholehearted support during the year. Club members have never hesitated to assist when needed, and this makes a President's task so much easier.

My wife Janet, together with Craig and Kristen, have been a tower of strength, in every way during the year. Janet has shared willingly and constructively in a number of projects such as the District Governor's visit, District Assembly, District Governor's changeover and tonight's function. During those times when I have been away on weekends on District Committee business, Janet and the family have held the fort.

I personally believe the sharing in Rotary by our Ladies is of vital importance. Rotary is better off for your involvement, and Horsham East in particular is a much better Club because of your efforts.

Thank you all for the privilege of being your President. I have enjoyed it immensely, and have tried to carry out the tasks to the best of my ability.

Treasurer: Our treasurer Rotarian Maurie Schuller has done a most efficient job with Club finances. His task was made more difficult by the resignation of former treasurer Doug Issell through the year. Our special thanks to Rotarian Maurie for this demanding job well done.

Nevertheless, a good standard has been maintained and as Club Service Director, I wish to thank all members who have contributed in some way, whether named here or not, and to particularly thank Club Service Committee Chairman and those members who filled positions at very short notice through the year.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT - 1978-79

The International Committee of the Horsham East Rotary Club arranged to meet on every third Tuesday of each month in the board room of the C.R.B. offices during the lunch hour from 1 - 2 p.m.

The functions of the International Committee were divided amongst the committee men as follows : -

1. I.P.A.C. - Graeme Lind.

Graeme gave a comprehensive report on the I.P.A.C. projects and he recommended that 78/1 project be adopted. This project was ratified by the Directors and supplied the means of sinking a well in Bangladesh for the cost of \$270.00.

2. F.A.I.M. - Reece Burgess, Ab. Dragonje.

At the Rotary meeting on 25th October, Reece introduced R.A.I.M. to our members and requested their support. Ab. collected 50¢ from each member and 50¢ for their wives and reported that the Club had a 100% subscription amounting to \$47. On 28th February Rotarian Ron Devereux of Warracknabeal spoke to our Club on his part in a R.A.I.M. team to New Guinea which he joined in July of 1978.

3. Matching Districts - Ray Leskie.

During the past Rotary year Ray has endeavoured on several occasions to contact Rotarians in central and West Africa, the countries with which Australia has been matched in the Rotary World, with little avail. Because of the political climate in those countries the utmost caution must be used to avoid reprisal against those Rotarians being contacted. However, Ray was instrumental in arranging for Peter Light's parents to speak with him in the U.S.A. and for Donna Bird to speak with her parents also in the U.S.A. Horsham East forwarded to Jay, a non Rotarian radio operator, our banner in appreciation of his services on Peter's behalf.

4. Rotary Foundation - Kevin Matuschka.

On 15th November our Rotary Club had the pleasure of listening to the leader of the Australian Group Study team that visited Brazil in April 1978. Rotarian Clem Quick, of the Warracknabeal Club, gave us an informative and entertaining description of Brazil and her people.

Stephen Phillips and John Heid were interviewers together with Jim Amps and Ned Carter of the Horsham Rotary Club to select nominees for the Group Study team to visit District 640 in U.S.A. and Canada. Our nominees were Gary Henry and Bruce Valpied. Bruce was successful in being selected on the district level and represented Rotary District 970 and Australia in May and June 1979. The Club has received several letters of appreciation from Bruce describing his enjoyable and educational experiences as a member of the team.

5. Asian Student Visit - Alan Vickers, Darry Lattanzio and John Heid.

During the latter part of this Rotary year considerable time and effort has been spent in arranging an Asian student visit to our Club. The research will be gladly handed over to the incoming International Committee in the hope that our ground work may be utilized.

6. Other activities that were organised during the year by the International Committee were selecting a guest speaker for World Understanding Week, at which Cr. Jan Van Veldhuissen shared her observations with us about the differences between Holland and Australia, and a fund raising afternoon at Mr. Van Dyke's farm at Drimpaen. About seven Rotarians and thier families met at the farm to pick up rocks and deposit them into gullies. Afterwards they enjoyed a barbecue together in Mr. Van Dyke's beautiful garden. He generously donated \$150 to boost our committee funds. I would like to record our thanks to John and his father for that opportunity.

In closing I would like to thank the Horsham East Rotary Club members for giving me the opportunity of service in the International Service Portfolio, for the support of President Bill, for the participation of the International Committee members and in particular the help given to me by Rotarian John Heid who acted as secretary of the committee and for the use of the C.R.B. premises for the monthly meetings.

i. Outside visits to : -

Vulcan,
Wheat Research Institute.

We believe that all Club Members will agree that these segments of our meeting are invariably interesting and we thank those rotarians who have contributed.

We regret that our intention to make some impact outside of the Club was not fulfilled.

Once again I thank my committee members, their wives and the Club's executive for their support.

COMMUNITY SERVICE REPORT - 1978-79

After circulating a "proposed list" of projects early in July members voted to support the following projects :-

To Support and Run Annual Art Show -

The annual art show was a great success hosted by Rob Cochrane and his Committee - members erected framework, hessian and decorations. It was the best we have put on and a great boost to the "arts" in Horsham and district.

To Sell Drinks and Icecream at Horsham Centenary Show -

The weather was kind to us on the last day and we raised \$1280 - manning 4 points for 2 days and 2 nights. Ladies of Rotary and members enjoyed the fellowship as we all endeavoured to support our roster.

To Support Meals on Wheels -

Members turned out for this and the job was done, but in early January most members were away, so all spares and extras were used.

To Support Horsham Art Complex -

Members joined in to support the start of an art building, space for the arts is sadly lacking in the present complex. Money raised by the Club would be subsidised by the Government at 2 : 1. An Art Association was formed and many Rotary members joined. Finally it was agreed that little could be done until the Horsham City Council looked favourably at the project. Land must be acquired in the city block to start the project, this land to be donated by the Council. Until this happens Horsham will fall short of its many neighbouring towns which have large Art Complexes and attract major art shows out of Melbourne.

To Support Horsham Youth Club -

This project was shelved because of political overtones. Our willingness to support it is evident enough.

To Help on Hospital Landscaping \$12,000 -

Mainly earthmoving - support from C.R.B. and Vulcan members, I felt we fell short on this one. The Hospital had its gardeners take over and complete the task before the new wing was opened by Dame Pattie Menzies.

To Continue to Support Karkana Fencing and Site -

Two good size fences were erected, a front and side fence - the side being 20 chain long. The other side netting was renewed and is in the process of being completed. Good fellowship comes out of this project as well as satisfaction of Club involvement. N.B. - we still have to be paid for this project : \$1,000 (approx.)

To Continue with River Beautification -

Veta Landt Memorial took continuous looking after and final touches were done. Huge boulders $\frac{1}{2}$ ton or more had to be taken out, lights replaced and trees replaced; vandalism is in Horsham. More lighting to the river area is proposed by Cec Hopper (electrician) and mesh surrounds still to be fixed for lights. Murray Minnie working on these. Suggestion is that each year the Community Service Director makes periodical checks on the fountain, particularly in summer.

To Man Apex Fishing Contest -

14 Stewards and 3 fish collectors manned the river and in 96° temperatures. A long day for volunteers but the \$350 was nice to receive into Club funds.

Barbecues and Catering for Homesteading Day -

Because it was the Arts, we participated, being very cautious from last year's "Young Farmers" fiasco. Although we worked flat out on the barbecues the weather did not sell many drinks and we had opposition for tea and sandwiches. We came out square, but were promised reimbursement from the Council of \$100. Members had a good day.

Erection of Frames for Photographic Show -

Once again the frames and hessian, but for reward \$250. Plastic bags full of sand had to be washed by members and the sand delivered to the local kindergarten.

Centenary Show Photographs -

Frames and hessian to convert a shed into a gallery - no charge this time.

Horsham Emergency Service -

A donation to enable this service to buy and erect a large radio tower.

Support for Motor Vehicle Safety Driving Range -

After two talks to the Club by Horsham Technical School Apprentice Chief, the Club decided to support the project. To date the Council have donated the land, the Shire the grading, the pipes and cartage free. We should make a substantial donation and also have agreed to lay the 7 drains of 30' each. Final levels still to be decided on. Positions of drains now confirmed. When completed the range will be available to schools, sporting bodies and police. Many young lives may be saved.

Summary -

A good year of smaller projects by a good Committee. Attendance was 80% at meetings, which were both lively and productive. No large project was found and in some projects we acted as catalysts only.

My personal thanks to all Committee members for your individual effort, the support of my fellow Directors and the never ending support of Club President, Bill Ower.

The Committee continued to keep close ties with the Horsham Rotoract Club. Meetings were attended on a regular basis. The Rotoract Club shared fellowship with our Club once during the year. We had the pleasure of Rotoract President Liz Schneider at another meeting.
