INTERNATIONAL SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT 1979/80

The Cabaret Ball held 20th June climaxed a fruitful year for the International Committee.

Once again the Club achieved 100% subscription to F.A.I.M. and the Club's support was most gratifying. The Club also achieved the 400% plateau with Rotary Foundation and our thanks must go to Sergeant of Arms Maurie Schuller who extracted the 20g from our pockets weekly with monotonous regularity. A high light for our Committee during the year, and for the Club too, was the awarding of a "Paul Harris Fellowship" to the Mayor of Horsham, Cr. Brian Brooke, at the 75th Anniversary Dinner.

In March the Club, together with the Horsham Club, hosted a Group Study Exchange team from Canada and the U.S.A. climaxed with a B.B.Q. at the home of James and Dianne Schwarz.

The Club attempted to make contact with our nominated Club/District in India but this was not achieved. It would appear that some overseas countries lack interest in this program of Rotary International.

One of our objectives for the year was to make contact with Refugee families in an endeavour to settle a suitable family in Horsham. As a local Committee comprising of Service Clubs and local Churches was formed with the same purpose in mind, it was decided to offer our assistance to this Committee instead of going it alone. Our representative was John VanDyke who ably served on this Committee. Attempts were made during the year for the Club to assist with hosting of selected families but unfortunately a mutual date could not be arranged. However the Club were able to assist the Apex Club in entertaining 2 Vietnamese families at a B.B.Q. at Roses Gap in March which proved beneficial to all concerned.

To raise funds for the 3H Appeal, the Committee decided to run a Cabaret Ball featuring the Wedderburn Old Timers and the New Harlem Jazz Band. The event socially was a great success and will be remembered by all who were fortunate to attend for a long time to come.

Financially, it would appear that we will at least break even. Lack of support from some 35% of our Club nearly spelt disaster, but Ab Bragonjie came to our rescue by donating a Cassette/Radio as a Competition prize which raised \$132.00.

Realising that we would not be able to raise sufficient funds to raise the Club to Plaque status under the 3H program, i.e. contribution \$30.00 per member to the appeal, the Board approved the necessary funds to achieve this objective. I would like to thank all members who assisted to make the Ball a success. The working bees were exceptionally well attended and made the work involved seem light. The ladies of Rotary especially have the thanks of the Committee for the attractive table settings prepared for the evening. Together with the overhead decorations these settings changed the character of the Town Hall substantially and set the atmosphere for the evening.

In closing I would like to thank all members of the Committee for their assistance and co-operation during my year as Director.
