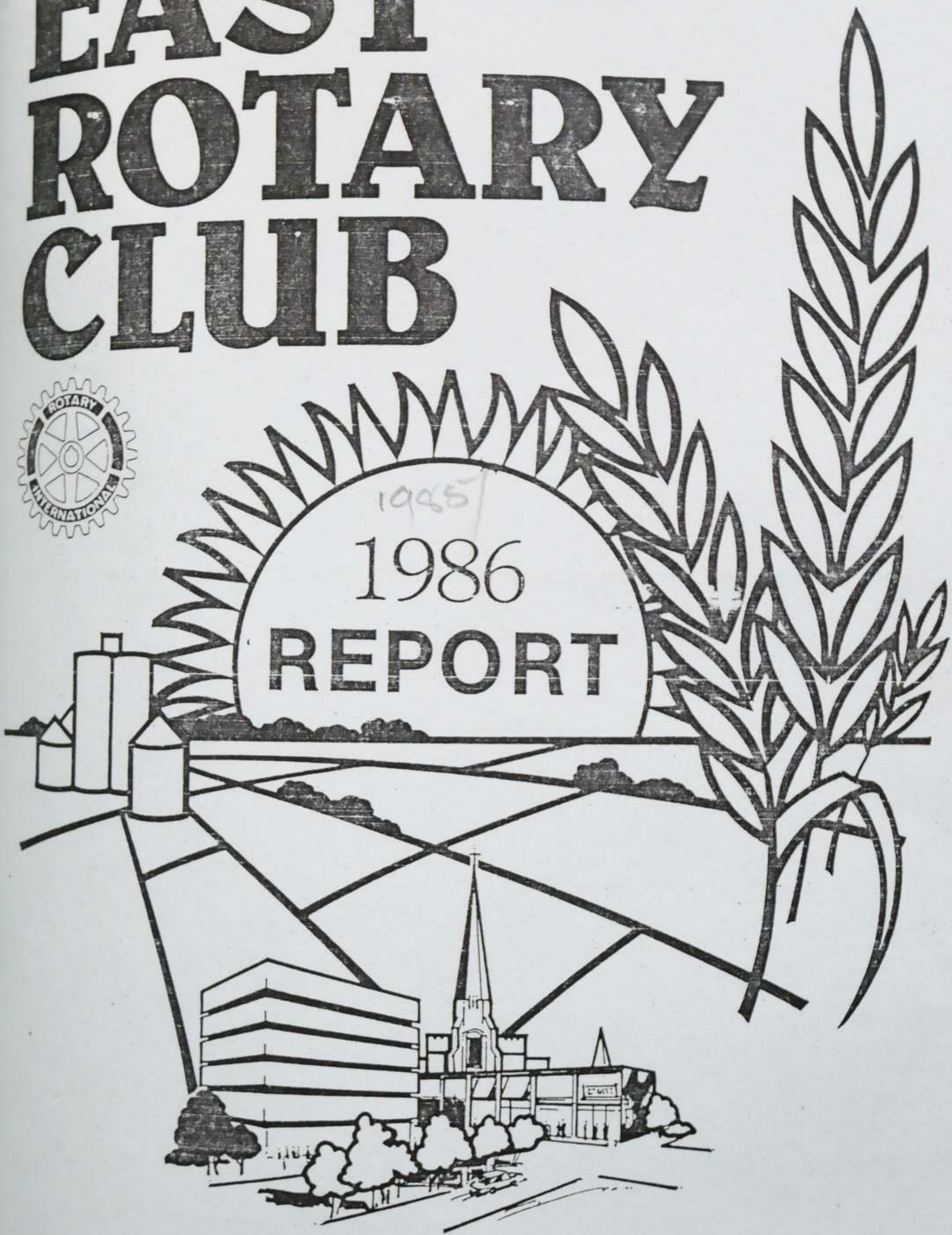

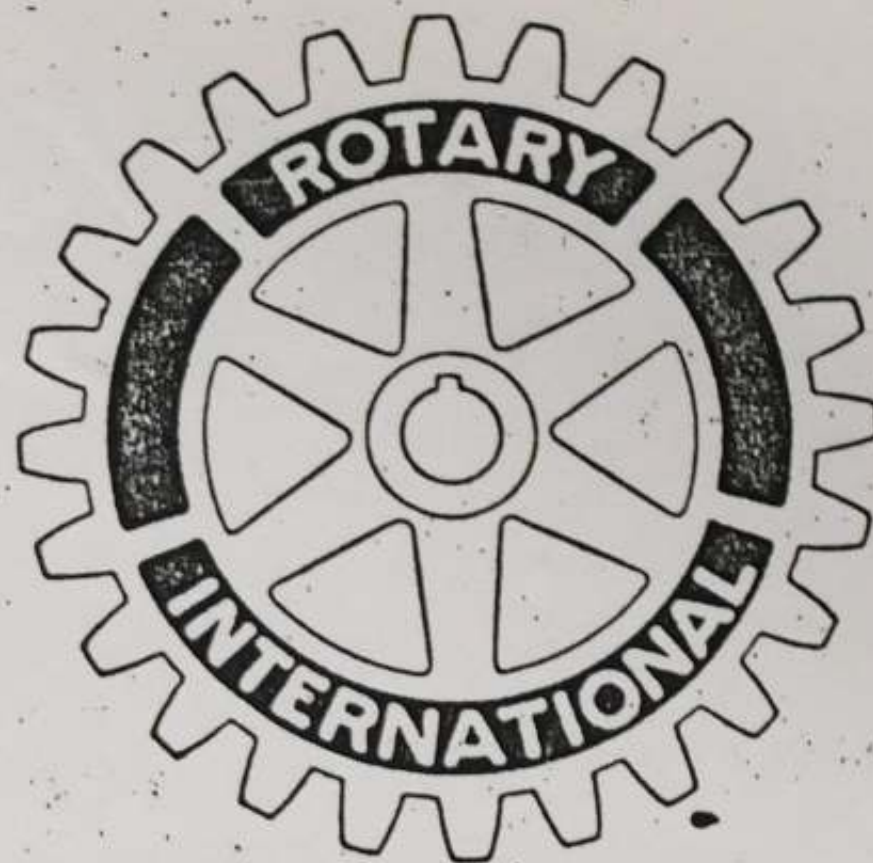

COMMUNITY SERVICE REPORT 1985-86

Throughout the Rotary year community service activities of the club were in the main those on going activities in which the club has been involved in recent years. These activities, however, involve Rotarians in a range of community service activities and were as follows:-

MEALS ON WHEELS:

Eight Rotarians were rostered each day for the weeks of January 27-31 and June 16-20.

FISHING CONTEST STEWARDS

Twelve Rotarians were rostered during the Apex Fishing Contest as Stewards on March 9. A Club Roster covering 1986-1988 involving all club members was prepared.

HORSHAM EAST ROTARY PARK AND VETA LANDT MEMORIAL FOUNTAIN WORKING BEES

A small number of Rotarians participated in Working Bees held on December 1 and March 2. The main work involved tidying up and cleaning out the fountain and painting of picnic tables and seats. This work was co-ordinated by Rotarian Murray Minne. SELLING DRINKS AND ICE CREAMS

DISTRICT NURSING HOME APPEAL GALA DAY - OCTOBER 27

Club members followed on the show effort by again selling soft drinks and ice creams at the Gala Day held at the Horsham Oval. This activity gave a nett profit of \$336.00 plus a raffle profit of \$87.00.

AUSTRALIA DAY BREAKFAST JANUARY 26

Some Rotarians were involved in organisation and servicing an Australia Day Breakfast held in May Park. This was part of a combined Horsham Service Club participation.

KARKANA DISCO - APRIL 16

Once again Rotarians organised and attended a barbeque tea and Disco for Karkana people. A pleasing attendance of Rotarians contributed to the success of the evening, as did the generous contribution of Rotoractor Mark Schumann and his "Merry" band. Thanks Mark.

To all Horsham East Rotarians, their efforts with community service both as individuals and through organisations, including Horsham East Rotary are acknowledged.

FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT 1985-86

Before the end of the 1984-85 year the incoming Fellowship Committee met to formulate a general plan for the following year.

The Committee agreed that fellowship was an attitude to be fostered week-by-week, rather than something which resulted in (or from) two or three major functions through the year. It was decided that a number of ladies nights, Club exchange visits, and other functions should be arranged during the year to promote greater fellowship amongst Club Members, families of members and the wider field of Rotary.

However, it became obvious during the year that this approach to Club Fellowship was not accepted by the membership as wholeheartedly as the Committee had anticipated. Attendances at fellowship functions were not always as large as expected, (in fact some were very poor) and there were suggestions that too many nights were spent away from the normal venue, or away from the usual meeting format.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT

1985 - 1986

This year began with a bonus from the work of the previous year's Committee, when we were privileged to have two of our Horsham East Rotarians join the Yule Island P.N.G. F.A.I.M. (Fourth Avenue In Motion) project. Our thanks go to Norm Murch and Kevin Plush together with his wife Joan for representing our Club. Kevin and Joan were on Yule Island between 3.8.85 and 17.8.85 and Norm between 17.8.85 and 31.8.85. The project in which they helped was to erect a new dining hall 30m X 12M at Our Lady of Sacred Heart High School.

The Rotary Foundation Scholarships were a major part of this Committee's year. District 978 changed the interview dates from September to May, thus giving this year's Committee the opportunity to nominate two applicants to the Scholarship.

We were fortunate in finding two young men we felt would represent this Club with distinction. Our September Nominee was Chris Jenkin, who is a Psychologist with the Alcohol and Drug Rehabilitation Centre of Palm Lodge. Chris did not win the Scholarship, however, he did go through to the final district interviews. Our second nominee (May) was Damian Knight who is at present an undergraduate scholar at the Lincoln Institute studying Orthoptics, with a desire to further his studies in England. At the time of writing Damien had not been through any district interviews.

For our I.P.A.C. (International Projects Advisory Committee) project we combined with the Rotary Clubs of Stawell, Croydon, Horsham, Ararat and Warracknabeal to provide funds for badly needed equipment to Helena Goldie Hospital in the Solomon Islands. The combined total gifts from the above clubs came to \$2,732.43 of which \$400.00 was our contribution.

During the year my Committee has had two people speak to the Club. The first was Malcolm Taylor of the Horsham Club who spoke of his experiences in travelling through Eastern Europe. We were fortunate in having Sister Joseph Mary from Yule Island who spoke on the benefits of Rotary through the F.A.I.M. projects.

Horsham East, also, had a Nominee for the group study exchange team. However, the Nominee was unsuccessful.

This Committee joined in a R.I. Peace project in the form of a High School student to write a "Letter of Peace".

In conclusion I would like to thank my Committee for their support during the past year.

As part of Vocational Service Month in October, we arranged an address by Mr. Ian Spicer, Director of the Employers Federation, on the topic "Employer-Employee Relations". The evening held at Jakades restaurant, attracted one hundred and seventeen Rotarians, ladies of Rotary and interested business people. Mr. Spicer's thought provoking talk stimulated much discussion amongst those present. Thanks are due to Rotarian Bill Ower for his work in organising this function.

Nine Rotarians willingly donated their services to conduct mock interviews for year Ten School Students in order to provide them with practical experience in applying for a job. Each student was required to apply in writing for a position in the firm with which the Rotarian was associated. This was considered a valuable exercise in preparing the student for job seeking in the future.

The two Vocational site visits planned for the second half of the Rotary year were deferred owing to the large number of meeting nights committed to other functions. Information of these visits has been passed on to the incoming Committee for appraisal and possible inclusion in their list of projects.

In conclusion I extend thanks to members of the Vocational Service Committee for their support and assistance during the year.

1986 WIMMERA ART-CRAFT SHOW

The 1986 Wimmera Art-Craft Exhibition broke new ground in opening on Thursday 22nd May instead of on a Friday, as in past years. This gave an extra day's duration. The opening received comparable support with previous openings but the intention of active promotion in the business area was marred by heavy rain all day. This did not give us a chance to really test the value of the additional day.

The opening by Brian Carter, Landscape consultant of Wartook was humorous and tied in well with Judge, Robert Horne who awarded the Best painting to Box Hill Artist Maureen Smith for her oil "Apollo Bay Pastoral".

A successful raffle of an oil painting by Judge Robert Horne was won by Horsham man Graeme Funske.

Sales were below previous years, and it was disappointing that three sought after artists failed to send their entries. All these entries were in the \$150 - \$250.00 price bracket, which in past years proved to be readily saleable. Another area of frustration was the late arrival of entries, with about 25% being incomplete in detail and requiring follow up.

The craft exhibits and demonstrators were all regulars and added to the quality of the exhibition.

Additional display boards allowed a better layout and presentation. Small stands on loan from Stawell Rotary helped display the craft exhibits very well.

I am grateful to all Rotarians who assisted in dozens of ways without hesitation when asked. My special thanks to President Bill Davey, & President Elect, Gordon Ryan for their encouragement during the days that it felt the show was not going to happen.

To the Club as a whole, thank you for the experience.

At the time of writing some monies are still to come in, but it looks like \$1,800.00 profit.
