PRESIDENTS ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1988-89

This year, the eighteenth in the history of the Horsham East Rotary Club has resulted in some notable achievements, but has also brought some serious difficulties.

These problems were eventually overcome and it is my belief that the Club is the better for having faced and weathered the storm.

It is disappointing to report a considerable decline in membership. About half the resignations were due to business transfers or changes, which resulted in members being unable to attend. Six new members have been inducted and we welcome new Rotarians and their ladies of Rotary.

We record with sadness the passing of Rotarian Lester Mitchell. Lester had been in ill health for some time and was the only Honorary Member in the history of the Club. We miss him.

In spite of the difficulties, and the decline in numbers the Club has been active, particularly in the last six months. We have probably achieved more through working bees than for a number of years past. The Club is now in good heart; the feeling of fellowship is strong and growing; and members are working solidly together on several large projects.

A very successful Art and Craft Show was held last August and over \$6,000 profit was realised. Dennis Witnitz, chairman of the committee, personally put tremendous effort into the show. He and his committee are to be congratulated. Thanks Dennis.

Indications are that this year's show could attract significantly more entries than last year. Thank you Dennis for continuing as chairman.

The success of the Art Show highlighted the need for more display boards, and for storage and working space. The Club purchased a steel frame building some years ago and now at long last it has been erected to cater for these needs. We extend our grateful thanks to Chris Lloyd for his magnificent effort in planning and supervising the building which was completed to a usable lock up stage in only six weeks. Thank you Chris for all your hard work. We are sorry your business transfer will prevent you from using the building but we expect you back for the opening ceremony.

I thank all other members who so willingly assisted in these two projects through working bees and in many other ways.

The City Council have also been of considerable help with the Club building and I ask you Mr. Mayor, to accept our thanks.

I thank Bill Ower and his Polio Plus committee, and all Rotarians and Ladies of Rotary for their support of this worthy cause. This has enabled us to reach our target of almost \$10,000 in three years.

In January we welcomed home exchange student Tania Aisbett from Sacramento U.S.A. and farewelled outgoing student Paul Fennell to Kitchener, Canada. Tania was a great ambassador for Australia and Paul has settled into his host community well. We wish our nominee student Nicolle Nixon well in her District interviews.

Kuniko our model exchange student from Japan was farewelled in March and the Club looks forward to the next incoming student Gerhard Meier from Norway in August.

Thanks to counsellors Ron Smith, Rob Walter and John Waddell and Rob Aisbett for agreeing to be counsellor for Gerhard.

During the year I have enjoyed working with District Governor Alf Swan and Helen and District Governors Representative Ben Bentley and Joan. Ruth and I thank them for their friendship and support, and I thank Alf and Ben for the considerable assistance they have given me.

Immediate Past President Bob Mibus consistently provided support and encouragement and I do thank you for your help Bob. Ivan Pearson, former Club Service Director gave considerable help in my year as President Elect and for a large part of this year. My sincere thanks Ivan. I am very sorry your changed work circumstances made it necessary for you to relinquish your position as President Elect and caused your resignation.

Stan More as Treasurer and John Nunn who stepped into the Secretary's role at a minutes notice have both been most efficient and thorough in carrying out of their duties. Thank you both.

Directors Peter Ridge, Bruce Johanson, Geoff Tually, Brian Brooke and Bill Davey worked well in their portfolios and I thank them especially Brian and Bill who filled vacant positions at short notice. We are indeed sorry to lose Peter through removal from Horsham.

Thanks to Sergeant Kevin Hogan and his assistants. Kevin's contagious humour always promoted a laugh, even when he forgot the punchline!

This year the Program Committee and Bulletin Committee were combined with, I think, excellent results. Thanks to chairman Geoff Chisholm, Editor Rob Walter and reporters. Especially, grateful thanks to Christene Marshall for her consistent and painstaking work in producing our weekly Bulletin and this Annual Report. Thank you very much Christene.

Thanks too, to all other chairmen and committees for jobs well done. Often the smaller committees are taken for granted but they form a very important and necessary part of the organisation. The work of committees such as Properties can be quite onerous, and I thank you all.

Ruth has assisted me greatly during the year in many ways and I thank her for this, and for her work with the ladies and Kuniko.

To Bill Ower, I thank you for stepping into the President Elect position and I wish you and Janet all the very best for the coming year.

In conclusion, my most heartfelt thanks goes to you the Rotarians (and ladies) of Horsham East for the support and encouragement you have shown during the past sometimes very difficult months. I'm quite certain you often did not realise just how much your spontaneous words of encouragement meant to me.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE REPORT 1988-89

Early in the year the Vocational Service committee considered quite a number of projects and events designed to promote high ethical standards in the workplace. It had hoped to promote greater awareness of the four-way test amongst members by organising a debate on its relevance to today's business climate. This is an idea that the incoming committee may wish to pursue further.

Three Vocational Service visits were held during the year. The first was a visit to TAFE after our regular dinner meeting on the night of 7th September. The manager of the TAFE centre in Horsham, Mr Kevin Alsop, showed interested members over the teaching facilities of the college. For most members the highlight of the evening was the inspection of the very well equipped motor mechanics department. However for Kevin Plush! he was so totally absorbed in some of the reading material in the library that he had to be forcibly removed so that the door could be locked. The take-home message was that even Rotarians are not too old to learn!

Rob Marshall organised the next visit to the Horsham Sewerage Farm at Haven. This visit was a precursor to another to the new Irrigation Research Farm, immediately west of Horsham, held on the evening of 16th November. This visit was hosted by the farm manager, Denis Pye, and his wife Marion, who provided a sumptuous barbecue with the trimmings. A bus tour of the farm followed dinner. During the tour Denis explained the irrigation layout, and the laser levelling needed to achieve the desired control over irrigation. The bus tour finished with a visit to the huge holding dam which must hold all of Horsham's effluent accumulated through the winter. Denis explained that all this effluent must be utilised during the summer irrigation season so that the dam is completely empty before the onset of the next winter. It is understood that the capacity of the holding dam may need to be increased in the future if Jack McIllree is to make further visits.

At the time of writing the Vocational Service Committees of Horsham, Horsham East and Warracknabeal Clubs were organising a Stress Management Seminar to be held at Longerenong College on Sunday, 18th June. This topic received a lot of coverage at last year's District Assembly and David Peck of the Horsham Club together with Marie Aitken, are to be congratulated on taking the initiative in the organisation of this seminar.

COMMUNITY SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT 1988-89

The Committee's work has been of a lower profile than past years due to several members resigning from the Club during the year.

However several tasks undertaken were successful while several remain to be completed.

The then Director, Darrell Kennedy organised a wine tasting evening resulting in sales profit. The Horsham Show drinks and ice cream sales raised some \$1,200. Further income came from the provision of stewards at the Apex Annual Fishing Contest.

Meals on Wheels delivery was undertaken in February and our next rostered turn is in July. Recently the Board approved and the Club agreed to support Meals on Wheels for an additional two weekly period making four weeks annually.

Our initiative in upgrading wheelchair maintenance in Horsham by arranging and supporting training for a local tradesman at the Regency Park Centre in Adelaide has been followed with a \$500 donation to wheelchair testing and research. Arrangements are now in hand to have a second Horsham tradesman trained at the Regency Park Centre.

Rotarians assisted the Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal as collectors in July 1988 and again in May this year.

Support as drink waiters at a major Art Gallery function was given in July 1988.

The Club building while not exactly a community service project will be an aid to the provision of future services to the community. Since the erection of the shed recently many man hours have gone into the surrounds at the site.

The tree year project of planting trees for an urban forest beside the Vulcan Foundry has not been a scene of much activity but the established trees will need maintenance and further plantings next season.

I believe that new ideas and initiatives are needed for the Community Service committee and I ask Rotarians to bring forward new ideas.

INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE REPORT 1988-89.

A range of activities were conducted by the committee this year.

We joined with Horsham Rotary Club in calling applications for membership of a female Group Study Exchange team to visit Missouri U.S.A. Three applications were received and interviewed. Two were selected, one to represent Horsham and one to represent our Club, to proceed to the Zone interviews at Dimboola. Following selection of the two applicants, my wife provided an 'induction to Rotary' session. This session was conducted to provide for an enhanced chance of selection and also to provide for an increased understanding of Rotary.

Later in the year we again joined with Horsham Club to call for applications for membership of another G.S.E. team going to Sweden. Two applications only were received and I again provided a Rotary induction session with 'our' applicant. Unfortunately our applicants for each of the teams were unsuccessful.

Applications were called for the 1990/91 Rotary Foundation Scholarships. As with last year, no applications were received by either club. Perhaps this is an area the Club should review and determine how we might go about circulating information to likely applicants.

The committee decided to recognise Rotary Foundation and World Understanding weeks (November and February) by toasting selected clubs in France and Italy. David Leembruggen wrote to two clubs - only the French club responded. Their telegram was read to the Club in both French and English by courtesy of Brigitte and Chris Lloyd. For those who were not at the meeting when we toasted the Club and read the telegram, here is the text.

'Dear fellow Rotarians,

We received your letter with pleasure and toasted you at our meeting on 30th January. Although the distance between us is great the friendship is close.'

The idea was to communicate with another Club overseas and a video was probably the best method to achieve this. The Committee quickly focussed on the idea of preparing a video for forwarding to the host club of our exchange student Kuniko. Kuniko was to be the star and this was communicated to her and was immediately well received. Whilst Kuniko thought the video to be very good idea when the time came for action our 'star' became a little camera shy - but after a while this situation was overcome. After the taking of 'footage' for the video a fireside meeting was held at Ab Bragonje's to review and decide on the segments that would comprise the actual product. We have decided to produce the video in two parts as whilst much of the footage would not be of interest for showing at a Rotary meeting, ie a 15 minute programme, much of the footage would be of interest to Kuniko as a record of her time with us.
