PRESIDENT'S REPORT.
1990/91

The Rotary International theme this year has been 'Honour Rotary with Faith and Enthusiasm', and together with 'A Preserve Planet Earth' charter have provided us with goals and aspirations in Rotary Service.

To Vocational Service Director, Warwick knight, Youth Service Director, Barry Lattanzio, International Service Director, Ian Ladlow, Community Service Director, Frank O'Connor and Fellowship Director, Geoff Blake, I thank you and offer my congratulations to each of you and your committee members for your work throughout the year in attending to your avenue of Rotary Service. Details of these achievements are provided separately in the Annual Report.

Special thanks go to Jeff Meister and Trevor Bysouth as Secretary and Treasurer respectively. Jeff and Trevor have very effectively attended to their duties and ensured that our administrative and financial affairs have been kept in good order.

Neville Strachan provided leadership of the Art Show Committee and with them is commended on the outstanding success of the 1990 Art-Craft Exhibition. The success of the Art Show can be measured in both social and financial terms. Our thanks and best wishes are extended to Ken Dowsley who has taken up the job of Chairman of the 1991 Art Show Committee.

During the year there were a number of special occasions. These included the Club's 1000th Dinner Meeting which saw many former Horsham East Rotarians and Ladies of Rotary attending and was followed on the Sunday with a Barbeque and Official Opening of the Club Room by His Worship the Mayor, Cr. Kevin Dellar. Another special meeting was the Combined Services Club Dinner hosted by Horsam East. These were the 'Small Business Fights Back' meeting arranged by the Vocational Service Committee at which Peter Boyle, Director of the Small Business Association was the speaker and a meeting held in honour of a visit to Horsham of the German Consul General, Herr Fein, who spoke on 'A United Germany'.

Another special occasion again held was the Pride of Workmanship Award presentation meeting with awards presented by Her Worship the Mayor, Cr. Gayle Crooke.

It is pleasing to note the many community service activities in which the club is involved. These include Meal-on-Wheels, the Red Shield and Red Cross Appeal Door Knocks, the Australia Day Barbeque Tea, Sheep Meat for Needy Families and the Bus Trip for the Elderly.

The efforts of our On-to Conference-Secretary, Rob Aisbett are gratefully acknowledged. The Club was also well represented at the District Assembly held recently at Stawell.

Six new members were inducted into membership of Horsham East this year. These were Colin Bills, Peter Dougherty, Bob Hayes, Iain McNee, Alan Vickers and Peter Ziebell. To these gentlemen and their ladies of Rotary we again extend a warm welcome.

Past President Bill Davey has been on sick leave for most of the year and to Bill and Kaye and family you can be assured that we are constantly thinking of you and offer our best wishes for Bill's recovery.

The Club continues to support Rotary Foundation with Fines and Coppers and this year proceeds from the weelky raffle went to the Australian Rotary Health Research Fund. Joe Freijah has coordinated the raffle with members being rostered to donate prizes. Well done everyone.

In conclusion I would like to say a very special thank you to Rosemary and to thank all the Ladies of Rotary for their contribution to the Club, both by way of support for our many shared activities but also for your separate efforts. Community Service Committee

This year we have maintained the ongoing Community Service Projects.

Meals on Wheels: Suggestions made at a club service meeting have enabled us to overcome roster difficulties.

Vulcan Tree Plantation: Last year we replaced one hundred trees and shrubs with the assistance of school children from the Horsham North Primary School.

Rotary Park Fountain: Under Geoff Chisholm's guidance a considerable amount of work was put into the cleaning of the fountain and surrounds this year; the efforts show. Cec Hopper organised for the repair of the fountain lights following a bout of vandalism.

Horsham Show: The sale of drinks gave us a profit of around \$1500, and the weather was ideal this year for this purpose.

Australia Day Barbeque: Despite the windy weather Horsham East Rotary and other service clubs combined to provide BBQ meals for those attending the Australia Day services. Frank Rosbotham of Horsham Rotary provided a very refreshing milk drink for the workers.

Red Shield & Red Cross Door-Knock Appeals: Members participated in these appeals. The Salvation Army reported a record collection for this year.

Apex Fishing Contest: Fourteen members of the club, and some of them at short notice, were rostered on duty as marshalls for the fishing contest. A contribution has been forwarded to our accounts by Apex.

Meat for the Needy: Following the example of a Rotary Club in Perth, Ken Dowsley organised for sheep to be slaughtered and the meat to be distributed to the needy. This was a one off project.

I take this opportunity to thank the members of the Community Service Committee for their support and on behalf of the Committee I thank all those club members who participated in any of the above projects.
