### **AMBASSADORIAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 1994-1995**

First selection was Brendan Howard, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Warmambool Central. Only one scholarship was available, our candidate Suzanne Speakman, impressed the panel and was invited to apply again. Ambassadorial Scholarships are funded from the Rotary Foundation.

### **GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE**

There were eight applicants applied for a chance to represent the club on a study trip to Germany. Richard Morris was selected but was unsuccessful at District level.

Horsham East was invited by Horsham Club to a presentation from the visiting Group Study Exchange Team from Germany.

Euan Thompson was nomination for Group Study Exchange Leader but was unsuccessful.

### **F.A.I.M.**

Construction of a Rotashelter on Manono Island, Western Samoa.

Construction team of Rtn. Ken Dowsley, Rtn. Barry Bell, Horsham East Rotary and Leigh Stephens, Rotary Club of Altona North, departed 3rd October and returned 16th October, 1993 successfully completed (with local help) the cyclone shelter. Reinforced concrete base, braced and tied timber and marine ply walls, screwed and tied colour bond roof, wind proof windows and door. We were accommodated by the Chief and Mayor and his family, Tuafoe Ausage of the village of Lepuiai. The local food was roast bananas, taro, breadfruit, rice, fish, coconut, porridge, lobster, chicken and pork. A very rewarding project. The Club will also support the Australian Rotary health Research Fund with \$1000 being proceeds from our weekly club raffle. Thank you to all Rotarians for providing the weekly prize and to Rotarian Joe Freijah for a job well done.

John and Anne Waddell are attending the International Conference in Taipei, Taiwan in June. We hope for a report later in the year.

At the start of the year the committee budget was \$1000 to support Rotary Foundation with proceeds from fines and coppers. This target is within reach and should be met.

Through the D.G. Dennis Wilson as an ongoing District Project I am now in the process of establishing a sister District Relationship with District 3330 in Southern Thailand.

Two weeks later my Mum and Dad came over to visit me. We went to Cairns and Sydney. Big trip! And after this I moved to my last host family, the Sostheim's.

Another trip started for me, on the 12th of May: my Safari, with the other exchange students from the district, (9780). We've been to Coober Pedy, Alice Springs, Mataranka, Katherine, and I climbed Ayers Rock! We had a great time. I really enjoyed sharing my time with some other students.

Now it's nearly over! I would like to thank very much the Club, and the president, Rob, for hosting me. I had a wonderful time with you. You gave me the opportunity to speak English and to live with some excellent host families.

Declining profit margins (see balance sheet below) may well relate to "Economic Times" or demand a new direction from the club.
