INTERNATIONAL SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT

Horsham East Rotary International Committee focussed on the idea of extending the Club's understanding of the Indian Culture. It was felt that such an understanding would develop closer ties with our Indian counterparts and quite possibly create the foundation for future plans and events and cross cultural exchanges.

In conjunction with these ideas, the possibility of approaching and establishing a "Sister Club" with district 3140 Bombay has been suggested. It is hoped that this may become a reality during the 1995/96 Rotary year.

Aside from this being our major program focus the committee also hoped to increase knowledge of multicultural issues. It was felt that by involving local identities from different cultural backgrounds, the contributions they have made to our community would be honoured. This was a successful venture in as much as we were able to share a very enjoyable night that included a too brief overview of their countries of origin. Participants were :

Importantly, some of the first ventures of the committee included working together with Horsham Rotary Club in arranging a joint weekend conference for the Rotary Foundation with John Thorne from Hobart as the guest speaker. This proved to be a most successful weekend and was attended by D.G. Geoff Tually as well as representatives from 25 other clubs from across the area.

Late in October 1994 the group conducted zone selection interviews to choose the FAIM candidates who would be proposed to the District Convention. This was an excellent team activity for all participants in the sense of opening a window onto the experiences of some exciting achievements and five special people. Of these candidates, two were proposed to the final interview stage.

Early in 1995 the committee made arrangements to host the G.S.E. exchange candidates from Sweden and Poland : Team leader, Evert Nilsson, Sweden, Carolline Lindberg and Anders Nyquist from Sweden and Viola Ptak and Wieslaw Jundzill from Poland.

An itinerary was mapped out to show the exchanges some of the sights and experiences of the Wimmera. Committee members offered excellent support for hosting accommodation and opportunities to share conversation.

Perhaps the greatest achievement of the year was that a team of six relatively unknown members came together and were able to enjoy planning, share some good moments of comradeship and an occasional bottle of excellent red wine.

Towards the closing of the 1994/95 year Brian Carter, as a guest of the International Committee, addressed the Rotary meeting and invited members into sharing the exciting future for Southcorp in

Horsham. His thoughts clearly linked Horsham and its people into the bigger national industrial picture and suggested a prosperous and hopeful future for such an alliance.

To close our activities for the year it was fitting that one of our final activities was that our Committee Chair, Pawel, was able to share some moments from his country of origin, Poland. Such a perspective clearly indicated where we would like to develop the program for 1995/96, which is to share more diverse experiences of other cultures and countries.

In 1995/96 many of the initiatives begun in the previous year will be extended and developed.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT

Employ Australia project

In October, The Rotary Club of Horsham East accepted the challenge of the "Employ Australia" committee, a project of "I am Australian". It was agreed that the campaign would be carried out jointly with the Horsham Rotary Club, using the facilities of the Wimmera Community College of TAFE, and with the assistance of the Horsham C.E.S.

Our task was to canvas all business houses within the commerce sector of the City of Horsham, a daunting task at the outset. The idea to earmark \$500 per club to employ 2 or more young unemployed persons to carry out the door knocking was received extremely well by the "I am Australian" committee and highly publicised in their journal.

An offshoot to our participation was that Jens Outzen, Marie-Loise's father, on learning of the story from the article in the Wimmera Mail-Times, has set about implementing a similar project in Denmark which has a similar unemployment problem of 340,000 people (11%).

The results of our efforts in Horsham :

245 businesses were canvased from which 119 responses were received. Of the respondents, 18 requested a visit from the C.E.S. to explain employment incentives. 3 businesses indicated that they would contact the C.E.S. 12 businesses responded that they had 15 positions available immediately. 16 responded that they thought 16 positions would be available next year as the economic situation improved. 46 stated the possibility of 48 positions that may become available over the following 12 months, but were unsure.

I take the opportunity to wish all those wonderful members of Horsham East Rotary Club and their families all the best for the future.
