PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It has been an honour and a privilege to have been President of the Rotary Club of Maryborough for the past year.

Sandra and I have had the opportunity to attend many Rotary & Community functions during the year and we can but marvel at the wonderful work of Rotary and the many Community organizations that we have visited with during the year.

Our Rotary International theme for the year "Rotary Shares" and our District Governors theme "Share Rotary" were very appropriate when you look back on the past year and our achievements.

Our meeting program arranged by PP Rtn Rod Brown, have been varied and informative. I would like to thank those members and guest's who gave of their time and expertise to keep the Club informed with what is happening in their lives and organizations.

There were a number of meetings that I felt stood out in my mind during the year, the first being the "Survivors Night". I thank those members and their partners who shared their experience as survivors of a heart attack. Their very open and frank accounts of their experience were very moving and an important warning to all of our vulnerability. The roses definitely smelt sweeter the next day.

Our night at the Highland Society with representatives from the Royal Australian Navy to introduce their newest ship in the fleet, HMAS Maryborough, named after Maryborough Victoria and Maryborough Queensland was very enjoyable. Lieutenant Commander Jak Wilson & Captain Gerry Savvakis gave us and insight into the commissioning of the new boat, and what life onboard the vessel would be like. As a result of their visit there was an invitation issued for a young member of our community to participate in part of her maiden voyage. Lucinda Johnson a 17 year old Off Campus VCAL student was nominated and selected to fly to Brisbane and join the "Nuship Maryborough on December 10th for the leg from Brisbane to Sydney. Lucinda, on her return attended a Rotary Dinner Meeting and recounted her experiences onboard a Navy ship.

On another night we were visited by the Commissioner for Small Business and representatives from Consumer Affairs and the ACCC. We enjoyed the company of a number of local business men for this very informative evening and it was indicated on the night that we should possibly invite each group back on separate nights, to give our business community a better opportunity to put questions to the various representatives.

Thank you PP, Rtn. Rod for an innovative and interesting program through out the year.

Our hard working Community Director, Rtn Brenton Fairchild and his team, with able assistance from all club members, have had a very busy year. The Rotary BBQ has been used on many occasions supporting community events from Land Care, CFA, Aero Club, Golf Club and Girl Guides just to name a few. The major community event for the year was once again the RACV Energy Breakthrough and I thank all members for their Marshalling services on the Rotary corner and Catering services on the BBQ trailer, this weekend is a huge commitment by all, but one that is appreciated by visitors and our community.

The Community Committee have been called upon on many occasions to erect the Marquee's on behalf of the Shire Council, and I thank all members who have assisted with these duties, it brings very valuable income into our Club, that we can put back into the community.

It has been decided by the Rotary Club, that a Catering Committee will be formed. The new committee will take over responsibility for all BBQ catering events taken on by the Club, this will allow the Community Committee to direct their attentions to more urgent and varied community projects. Thank you Rtn. Brenton, for your untiring devotion to your community and the Rotary Club of Maryborough.

The International Committee, so ably led by Rtn. Shane Dellavedova has continued this year with their support for schools and orphanages in Sri Lanka with shipments of books.

Their major fundraising has been the Rotary Golf Day, Rtn. Peter Silva's bookstall and the BRIT auction. Thank you to all members for their participation in these events and a special thank you to Rtn. Jim Field for his contributions with the BRIT auction day.

The first Maryborough Rotary Club "Shelter Box" has been placed in a refugee camp in Zimbabwe in South Africa and it has been decided by the International Committee to purchase another "Shelter Box" to assist the Rotary relief aid program in our international community.

Thank you Rtn. Shane for your innovative and humanitarian projects.

Youth plays a very big part in our Rotary year, and this past year being no exception. Rtn. John Sedunary and his committee have placed their accent on supporting groups of young people, whilst still retain current youth programs such as RYLA, RYPEN, National Youth Science Forum, Siemens Science and TYPO. Their sponsorship of the "Sleeping Stars" production of Peter Pan, which is in rehearsal and due to premier in mid September, is a wonderful program that has the involvement of some 40 young people in the age group from 5 years to 14 years. We look forward the being involved with this program for years to come, and maybe one of the participants will be influenced to enter the world of entertainment.

Thank you Rtn. John for your support to our future, our youth.

During the year our Vocational Director, Rtn. Glynn Jarrett relocated to Inglewood, to be closer to his work commitments in Bendigo. Before leaving Glynn had supervised and put in place a number of programs for the Vocational Committee, including the Powercor Central Goldfields Business Awards which was a joint effort between the Rotary Club of Maryborough, the Maryborough Chamber of Commerce, and the Central Goldfields Shire Council. We were very proud when our two nominees Mr. Greg Waters (Shine on Award) and Miss Kathryn Dent (Shine on Commendation) awards were announced. Both Greg and Kathryn were unable to attend on the day. They both received their awards at a special presentation at a Rotary dinner meeting.

CLUB SERVICE

It has been my privilege to serve the club as Club Service Director and Vice President during the Rotary year, 2007–2008. My role has been to work alongside the four club Service Directors and with Program Chairmen in supporting the service projects of their committees, and provide a communication channel to the Board. Every committee has been active over the past twelve months, and many positive outcomes have emerged from the hard work of the committee members. Here's a brief summary of some of this year's achievements.

The Bulletin committee (Chair – David Hare) has continued to keep our club members effectively informed of current and forthcoming Rotary events.

Sergeant Guy Blanche and his team have maintained a good spirit in our weekly club meetings with an ingenious and creative selection of fines and effective time management.

The Centennial Committee (Chair – John Bryant) has taken us through to the point where we're seeing some real progress on the Manse project. Planning has been completed, the necessary demolition work has been done and trades people are now at work shaping what will become a valued asset to our District Hospital and community.

The Rotary Foundation committee (Chair – David Tynan) has continued to build funds for the fight to eradicate Polio from the world and support other projects. This year, for the first time, we're providing members with the opportunity to top up their weekly donations as part of their meal payment to reach "Centurion" status. We hope to see this approach continue in coming years.

The Bowelscan committee (Chair – Bob Osborne)has had a very successful year with over 650 test kits sold to members of the community

in this area – the highest number for many years. We thank Jean Ritchie for her invaluable assistance in distributing and collecting kits during the last weeks of the program when Bob was away.

Whilst the Club survey suggested that members would like to see even more articles in our local paper, we have had a larger number of Rotary related articles published during the last twelve months than in many previous years, thanks to the hard work of Chair, Bob Osborne and his team.

The Brian Dowie Park (Chair – John Williamson) committee has continued to explore ways in which this asset could be of more benefit to the community. Committee members are currently exploring the possibilities of installing a toilet at the site although there are concerns that due to problems with levels, it might cost a large amount to make the link with the current sewerage pipes across the road. The group is also exploring the possibility of a dump pit for Caravans. The Club survey raised issues regarding our "ownership" of this attraction, and this matter will need to be settled during the coming year.

The Membership committee (Chair- Brian Thomas) has been very active this year with the presentation of a very useful membership night, almost a dozen new members considered during the year, and two new members actually installed during the twelve months.

The Fellowship Committee (Chair — Noel Jennings) has continued to effectively provide for the refreshment needs of our members whilst adding over \$3,000 to the coffers of the club.

Attendance Officer (David Brown) has continued to effectively monitor attendances this year, whilst Welfare officer (Grant Kennedy) has monitored the welfare needs of the club.

I would like to thank chairs of all committees for their diligent work in helping to maintain the services of our club over the last twelve months and also the hard working members of committees for their generous time and energy in implementing their committee's policies. It has certainly been another successful year in the Rotary Club of Maryborough, and I would particularly like to congratulate Derrick Marsden on his great year as President.

YOUTH SERVICE

It has been an honour to be the chair of the Youth Committee this year. To be a part of this team has allowed me to learn more about Rotary as well as enjoy the fellowship of members.

I believe that we have achieved the following:

MEC Breakfast program:

We were approached by a local business (the Moonlight Inn), which was keen to host a fund raising event – with the funds raised being donated to a local youth project.

At the same time, we were approached by the BEST START program which was seeking our assistance to purchase a new commercial toaster for the MEC breakfast program. (It is well known that children who have had a proper breakfast are more able to concentrate and enjoy school. The BEST START program provides a basic breakfast to over 150 MEC students each morning.)

Consequently, we were able to link the two organisations together and as a result, the Moonlight Inn hosted a fantastic flower display and fashion parade, which resulted in approximately \$2,000 being raised.

It should be noted that Joy Anderson was one of the key drivers for this highly successful event.

Sleeping Star Productions:

Sleeping Star Productions is a community based group that aims to provide children with a full theatrical experience from auditioning, rehearsing and performing, through to such things as set building and costume making. There are 41 children currently rehearsing for the musical Peter Pan, which will be staged on the 5^{th} and 6^{th} of September. (The children range in ages from 5 - 15.)

SSP is providing the following benefits to the community:

- It is fostering creative energy and talent within children;
- It is fostering leadership and organisational skills for teenagers and young adults;
- People of different generations are learning to work and share together as a close knit team;
- People who would not normally mix socially are now working together to create what will be a benchmark production;
- It is providing an opportunity for people who do not have other options to participate in a group activity;
- It is creating a real sense of community as people of all ages and from across the Shire come together;
- It is allowing people to see new possibilities and opportunities for themselves and for their community.

The Rotary Club of Maryborough has provided financial support (approx \$1,300) as well as administrative support. Two members of the club are on the management committee (one as a Rotary representative) and another member (Peter Silver) is the set building co-ordinator.

Thank you to Grant Kennedy who has been a major driver of this project.



Two people were nominated to attend the RYLA camp and both were accepted. Their feedback is that their experience 'was life changing' and as a result, both participants have set new life goals for themselves.

Thank you to David Hare and to Noel Jennings for helping to organize our participants.

National Youth Science Forum

This year, two students have been nominated to attend this program. Both are excellent candidates and it is interesting to note that both MEC and Highview College are represented.

Thank you to John Williamson for coordinating this project on behalf of the Club.

Strategic Direction:

Importantly, we have also decided on a broad direction for the Youth Committee, which will see the club working in partnership with the local community to address the real needs of our local young people.

While this is still a work in progress, we see that this provides many exciting prospects for not only our young people, but also the wider community. Already we are looking at such things as:

- Integrating our efforts with the other committees within the club;
- Participating in a mentoring training program, so that we can better connect (and assist) young people;
- Working with other local providers and networks to ensure that we have a whole of community approach;
- Ensuring that we support Rotary's 'traditional' youth programs;
- Revisiting the International Exchange program.

The year ahead is exciting as we finalise our approach and implement real actions. I am confident that both the club and the community will gain real benefits as a result of the work being undertaken by the Youth Committee.

Lastly, I would like to acknowledge the individual contributions made by the members of the Committee. We have had some long discussions about how we can best serve our community and, each person has taken on a project or assignment on behalf of the club.



MEMBERSHIP REPORT

Service Clubs generally have had a difficult time retaining past levels of membership. It is good to know that Rotary in Australia is having a good year this year with an increase of 390 members or 1.6%.

World wide, with 32,901 clubs and 1217901 members, we have increased by 1.96%.

Maryborough has had a difficult year with numbers, we have lost PHF PP David Boyes, Glyn Jarrett, Peter McCormick and PHF PP Charles Townsing. Four of these past members have in fact transferred into other Rotary Clubs. On the other hand we have welcomed Mark Edmonson, Ray Hannan and Neil Arbuthnot.

PHF PP Charles Townsing has made a big effort to overcome his remote location and remain a Rotarian and has joined an "e" Club, RECSWUSA (Rotary E Club South West USA), this means that he attends meetings via the internet and is happy learning a great deal from speakers on those internet meetings.

Our aim was to get our numbers back up to 56 this year but instead we will be at 50 so we need to continue our efforts. World wide figures indicate that only 10% of prospective members are inducted into clubs, we will need a big effort this year to regain our target membership and will need the help of all members to succeed.

Our major effort this year centred on an information night where we issued 32 invitations and had 17 attendees and will induct two of the participants. The effort will be made each six months in order to get our numbers.

It is obvious that we need this level of membership in order to run an effective Club and support Rotary's program in Maryborough, Victoria and around the world.

We thank all members for their contribution to our membership activities and look forward to a real growth in membership in 2008/9.

PROBUS

President Derrick and fellow Rotarians.

Probus the 'love child' of Rotary continues its growth throughout the South Pacific region.

Founded by Rotary in England in 1964, the movement spread to New Zealand in 1974 and to Australia in 1976. The wisdom of RDU in forming a committee to oversee the development of Probus proved to be a wise move. This sub-committee developed into the PCSP (Probus Centre South Pacific) committee which administers the organisation in the South Pacific area. Recently expansion has taken place in the Philippines and six (6) clubs have recently been formed. Within the South Pacific area, there are now approximately 200,000 Probians, in more than 2000 clubs.

I have been a member of the PCSP committee for five years with one more year to serve, which will be as secretary.

Closer to home District 9780 has 152 clubs (as against 62 Rotary clubs) with more than 12,000 Probians. Locally, Maryborough Rotary club has started four clubs, Maryborough Combines (25 years old in 2009), Maryborough Ladies (15 years), Avoca (11 years) and Dunolly (8 years).

The only criteria for joining Probus is to be no longer employed on a full time basis. Probus itself is not a fund raising organisation.
