Rotaract Conference Presentation: Kelsea Wall, Sam Schulz, Lainee Heeps.

The three Rotaractors made a great presentation highlighting their personal experiences over the weekend of the Conference in Adelaide.

Kelsea spoke about how she realised that the Rotaract community was far larger than she was aware of. Being a natural at making friends, Kelsea met and talked to a security guard at the zoo who covered a wide range of events. By the end of the night he had a lot of new friends, Sam had snuck out some food for him, the young man met a couple of former Rylarians who had attended the same camp as he had and he is now becoming a Rotaractor. Kelsea touched on one of the speakers—Derrick McManus who nearly lost his life in the SA Police Force when shot 14 times when trying to apprehend Tony Grosser.

Sam spoke on the journey to the conference, and covered workshops she had attended including one on “Hold your own Space”, and concluded her presentation by making the comments that she had not only gained a better understanding of Rotaract on a National level, but also developed a better understanding of herself.

Lainee, attending her first Conference, admitted it was an amazing experience. Highly nervous upon arrival Lainee quickly got over that when she started talking with other Rotaractors. Lainee spoke about the Service About Self Mental Health in Social Media. This was obviously a subject that Lainee is passionate about having lost a friend to suicide. Her message for us all is to keep an eye on our friends who may be suffering depression or struggling to cope.

All three Rotaractors thanked Rotary for their assistance in getting to Conference, highlighting the benefits gained.
