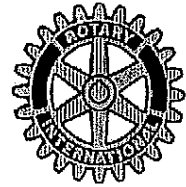

- _____1. Join a Club Committee. See the President to discuss your assignment.
- _____2. Attend a Club Board meeting. The Board usually meets the first Thursday of each month at 7:30 am at My Cup of Tea Restaurant located on Cornelia St. (Next to Nelson Flower Shop). The meetings last about an hour. Join your Club officers and learn a little of how the Club works.
- _____3. Attend a meeting of another Rotary Club. There is a list of nearby clubs in your Membership Directory, which is in your new member packet. Or, it is fun to do a make-up at another club while you are on a trip or vacation. A list of clubs all over the world is on the web at www.rotary.org or you can ask the Secretary for a copy of the Rotary International Directory. Plattsburgh Noon Rotary meets at the American Legion on Quarry Road every Wednesday at 12:00pm.
- _____4. Give a New Member Talk to the Club so we can all get to know you better. Five to ten minutes about your background and life here in Plattsburgh are all that's needed – just tell the story of where you are from, what you do now, and how you got to where you are now.
- _____5. Attend a presentation on service and orientation with Paul Raino. Membership Committee will help you coordinate this with Paul Raino.
- _____6. Within the first couple months new member to take on the weekly duties of Greeter and 50/50 sales as a way to get to know all the members of the club.
- _____7. Log in to Club Runner Website and update your profile and get familiar with the site. See Thom Gosrich for user name and password

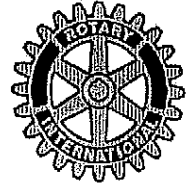

- Winter Carnival

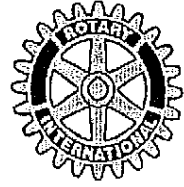
Plattsburgh Sunrise Rotary maintains committees focused on FIVE AVENUES OF SERVICE:
