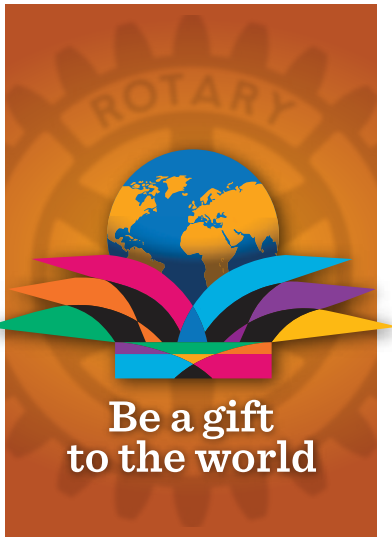

Rotarians Successfully Mentor At-Risk Students Through YIP



The Youth Incentive Program (YIP) matches at-risk 7th graders with a Rotary Club mentor who’s made a 5-year commitment to help that student establish and meet academic, athletic, social, and self-esteem goals – and develop into a productive and confident young adult.

Students who complete YIP and graduate high school are eligible to receive a Rotary scholarship toward continued education. To date, **\$130,378** in scholarships has been awarded from the YIP restricted Foundation Fund.

Currently, 23 local students are being mentored by Rotarians. Since its inception, every single YIP student has graduated high school and six have completed college.

The first-ever **Sacramento Century** bike ride and **Oktoberfest** fundraiser was an overwhelming success in meeting our vision to boost community participation, raise funds for Habitat for Humanity of Greater Sacramento, and increase exposure for the Rotary Club of Sacramento's charitable mission.

The fast start-up and event planning involved a Herculean effort by a small steering committee of Rotary members who organized more than 200 volunteers



– well over half of whom were Club members – and 1,200 participants.

Four fun and flat bike rides with 100, 65, 30 and 20 mile route options through the scenic Sacramento River Delta wine region offered "something for everyone," and included rest stops with food and drinks and SAG vehicles with supplies and gear.

The rides started and finished on Capitol Mall where cyclists and their families enjoyed a post-ride Oktoberfest with live music by Mumbo Gumbo, Playback, and City of Trees Brass Band, along with 10 food trucks, local wine and beer vendors, and a kid play zone.

The Sacramento Century & Oktoberfest on October 25, 2014, was a great achievement and promises to keep growing in contributions, community support, and Rotary's visibility throughout the Sacramento region.

Habitat for Humanity of Greater Sacramento was the beneficiary of the 2014 Sacramento Century and Oktoberfest fundraiser.



After successfully raising the necessary funds to sponsor a home build, Rotary Club of Sacramento members volunteered for carpentry, roofing, siding, interior trim, painting, landscaping and more. The grateful Vang family also contributed 500 hours of "sweat equity" towards their new home.

Construction of the new home on Sky Parkway in Sacramento began in March, and four months later the Vang Family moved in.

Tou Vang and Ong Yang have four children. Tou works full-time for a company which makes radiators and Ong is a former medical assistant who now stays home raising her children.

"The house is right next to this beautiful park which will be walking distance for our kids to play. For the first time in their lives, they will have their own rooms and a place where they can invite their friends over. It gives them a lot of joy," said Ong.

"I've seen all these people that are there only because they want to help others. I never knew that there are people out there like that. It just makes me feel so... incredible."

Rotary Club of Sacramento Leads Mission Trip to Guatemala



This April, Heidi Hershenhouse led a group of Rotarians from Clubs of the Greater Sacramento Area to Guatemala City and Machaquila, Guatemala, where they renovated a school and provided healthcare to students and local residents.

Sacramento Rotary Members Teach English in Pokhara, Nepal

In partnership with Young Life, the Rotary Club of Sacramento helped establish an English literacy center and purchase new computers for high school students in Pokhara, Nepal.

Rotarians **Diane Schachterle, John Wheaton, Katrina Salazar, Clayton Lee** and **Dave DeRoos**, traveled to Nepal for 12 days in October 2014 where they taught English at the center to young Nepalese of the poorest caste in the country.

Nepal's second largest city, Pokhara is located at an altitude of 5,500 feet in the foothills of the Annapurna mountain range, making it a popular tourist destination. With an economy dependent on tourism, it is essential that young people escape oppressive poverty by learning English so they may find employment in retail, restaurants, hotels and trekking – now more so than ever following the devastating Nepal earthquake in April 2015.



Rotary Named Funds and Scholarships



Rotary Scholarships and awards totaling **\$22,500** were given during the 2014-15 school year. They went to nine seniors from C.K. McClatchy, Sacramento, Rio Americano and Christian Brothers High Schools who demonstrated superior scholastic aptitude, vocational skills, leadership, community involvement, and financial need.

Scholarships, funded from the Named Funds below, are awarded to graduating seniors for full-time undergraduate enrollment at an accredited four-year college. Fields of study that will benefit the future of the community and foster the principles of Rotary are encouraged.

Anonymous Fund

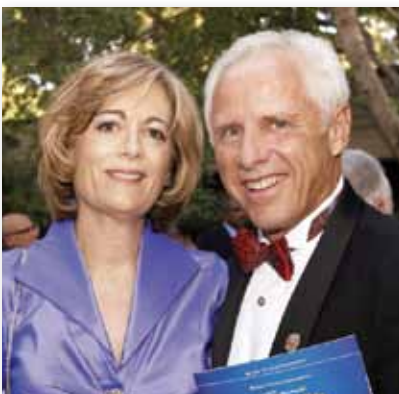

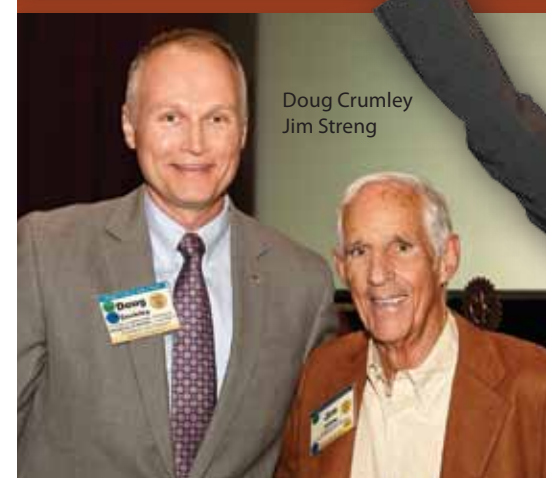
