Fundraising Committee

Project Committee

This committee oversees all service projects of the Hazleton Rotary and responsible for presenting ideas to the board for activities that Hazleton Rotary can do to benefit the community. These projects can be in the form of financial donations and/or hands-on projects, where Rotary members participate. This Committee also administers the "Service Above Self" Community Grant Program. These grants are intended to benefit nonprofit organizations in the Greater Hazleton community. Currently, Hazleton Rotary has several yearly projects that each have their own subcommittee. They are:

____ Centennial

This sub-committee is responsible for planning and executing the monthly projects that will be carried out to celebrate Hazleton Rotary's 100 years of service to the community. This committee will serve only during the 2021-2022 Rotary year.

____ Dictionary Project

This project's purpose is to order and distribute dictionaries to every third-grade student in the Hazleton Area School District on an annual basis.

____ Kidz Coatz Project

This project encompasses distributing new winter coats to children in need in the Hazleton Area School District.

____ Salvation Army Bell Ringing

This project is designed to assist the Salvation Army by manning the kettles during one day at WalMart in Hazleton around the winter holidays.

____ Scholarship (Academic & Technical)

This sub-committee oversses the application process and awarding of Hazleton Rotary's Academic Scholarship and technical Scholarship each year.
