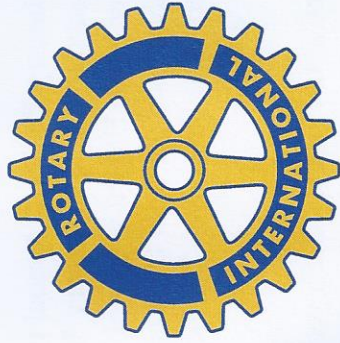

What We Do Locally

- **Dictionary Project:** Annual program designed to insure that every 3rd grader in the Hazleton School District has their own personal Dictionary. Rotary distributes over 750 dictionaries each year.
- **KidCoatz Project:** Each year with the help of the Hazleton Rotary Foundation, we distribute new winter coats to any needy child in the Hazleton Area School District.
- **Hazleton Rotary Scholarship:** The club annually awards a \$4,000.00 college scholarship to an area college-bound senior.
- **Polio Plus:** Rotary pioneered the effort to eradicate polio throughout the world. We have committed to eradicating this disease in the last remaining areas in India and Africa by 2015.
- **International Water Projects:** The Ballard Society was formed in 2010 to honor Jim and Nancy Ballard who donated \$25,000.00 to the Hazleton Rotary Foundation. This money is used for a variety of international clean water projects.
- **Other Projects:** As needs arise, the Hazleton Rotary may elect to engage in other projects.

What Does It Cost To Belong

Annual dues are \$225.00 which are billed yearly. Members are expected to attend at least 50% of the regular meetings, unless excused for good reason the by the club's Board of Directors.

Our members are expected to make a commitment of their time, by participating in service projects and social events.

- **Night at the Races, High Mountain Beer Festival and the Poinsetta Sale:** These 3 events are our major fundraisers during the year. Your financial and physical participation provide the necessary income to fund our Rotary projects.
- **Spaghetti Dinner:** This fundraiser provides the funds for our college scholarship. Rotarians are expected to sell dinner tickets and contribute their time in various dinner duties.
- **Salvation Army Bell Ringing:** Club members brave the cold to man the doors at Wal-Mart the last Saturday before Christmas.
- **First Friday:** Come and join your fellow Rotarians for a drink and some light conversation every first Friday of each month.
- **President's Party:** Join the party as we say farewell to our President and welcome the incoming President.
- **After Holiday Party:** After the craziness of the holiday season, relax with an elegant evening celebration.
