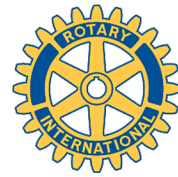

he talked about the program. He said the students choose to come here from all nine areas in the District. These are non-traditional students who may have had difficulties in traditional schools due to their home situation or run-ins with the law and other issues. Attending this program helps build skills which may lead them to get a job in a professional kitchen not just a fast food environment.

The program is backed by the California Restaurant Association and the students receive a Certificate of Competency upon graduation. They have a regular curriculum learning foundational “soft skills” like work ethic, being on time, getting along with co-workers and customers, being a team player, along with food safety and sanitization and cooking skills.

Chef Z also talked about the “Shoes for Crews” program they are involved with trying to raise money to purchase correct working shoes for the approximately 40 students in the program. Having safe, comfortable, non-slip footwear is essential to good working habits for these students. Arden Arcade Rotary was pleased to donate \$250 towards this program.

Chef Z teaches “you didn’t have a choice for your childhood, but your future is your choice.”
