It is time for Joy Drive 2025!

Joy Drive is Big Brothers Big Sisters' annual adopt-a-family program that brings holiday cheer to families in need. Generous donors provide gifts and support to ensure BBBSKC Littles and guardians feel seen and celebrated during the season.

In 2024, we supported **92 families through the Joy Drive program**, and we are looking for generous donors to make this season even brighter for the families we serve! If you, your family, your friends, your board, your other community groups, or anyone you know would like to get involved as a donor, sign-ups are now open.

How it works: Each donor will set their budget and indicate the family size they would like to sponsor. For example, a budget of \$400 might be paired with a family of three or four. Families range from two to ten members, and you may choose to sponsor more than one if you would like.

Once you sign up, BBBSKC will match you with a family and provide their holiday Wish List beginning October 21st. Donors are asked to spend at least \$100 to \$150 per person, with no maximum. After shopping, gifts should be wrapped, labeled with first names, and delivered to the BBBSKC office at 1709 Walnut Street, Kansas City, MO 64108.

Drop-off windows are December 1–5, December 8–12, or December 15–19, during office hours. If you need a different time, BBBSKC can make arrangements.

Tips: Please include gift receipts, and if you sponsor multiple families, keep gifts packaged and wrapped separately to make delivery easier. Don't hesitate to reach out to BBBSKC with questions!
