Purple Pals is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that aims to provide fun, freedom, and friendship to seniors in the early stages of Alzheimer's and dementia. We strive to create a community that provides support, compassion, and understanding for seniors and their caregivers.

- 6.9M+ Americans aged 65+ live with Alzheimer's.
- Projected 12.7M cases by 2050.
- 1 in 3 seniors dies with Alzheimer's or another dementia.

Purple Pals offers connection, support, and joyful companionship. Residents in memory care facilities often experience loneliness and isolation. Purple Pals bridges that gap.

We operate by connecting students and community members with local memory care facilities and senior centers to:

- We raise awareness among college students about dementia and the struggles caregivers face
