### **The Definition of Rotary**

"Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build peace and goodwill in the world."

### The Mission of Rotary

**Rotary's** primary mission is service. In the community, in the workplace, and throughout the world.

**Rotarians** build goodwill and peace, undertake humanitarian endeavors, and encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, demonstrated by their actions.

**Rotarians** develop community service projects that address many of today's most critical issues, such as children at risk, poverty and hunger, the environment, literacy, and water.

**Rotary's Motto**: "Service Above Self" & "They Profit Most Who Serve Best"

### The Rotary Foundation

The Rotary Foundation is our charity, a not-for Profit Corporation that promotes world understanding through international humanitarian service programs and educational and cultural exchanges. It is supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and others who share its vision of a better world.

### **The Object of Rotary**

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and in particular, to encourage and foster:

- *First...*The development of acquaintanceship as an opportunity of service;
- Second...High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- **Third**...The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life; and
- **Fourth...**The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

### **The Four-Way Test**

The following 24-word test created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers. It was adopted by Rotary in 1943.

"Of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
- 2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
- 4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?"

### **SERVICE**

### Five Avenues of Service

Based on the Object of Rotary, the Five Avenues of Service are Rotary's philosophical cornerstone and the foundation on which club activity is based:

- •<u>Club Service</u> focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning of the Club.
- •<u>Vocational Service</u> encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards.
- •<u>Community Service</u> covers the projects and activities the Club undertakes to improve life in its community.
- •<u>International Service</u> encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and to promote world understanding and peace.
- •New Generations Service recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities, service projects, and exchange programs.

### Obligations of Service

Rotary is a service organization, & each member is expected:

- •To participate in Rotary projects.
- •To serve willingly on one or more committees.
- •To attend Rotary District meetings such as Assemblies, Conferences, Seminars, etc., if at all possible.

### Attendance

Fun and fellowship are the hallmarks of the Daytona Beach West meetings. All members are encouraged to attend weekly. In the event you cannot attend a meeting, a makeup meeting can be attended at any Rotary club in the local area and the world at large. Rotary requires 50% attendance at a minimum.

### **Current/Past Service Projects**

<u>Campbell Middle School</u> an inner city school in Daytona Beach. Currently some of the students are mentored by various club members. These students have been identified as candidates for Take Stock in Children college scholarships which were funded by the club.

<u>Casa San Pablo</u> is a low-income housing facility for the elderly. Our club supports this facility not only with food for their pantry but with activities and fellowship for residents including monthly bingo and holiday parties.

<u>Guyana Water Project</u> several club members that have made trips to Guyana for the evaluation and implementation of a clean water delivery system and medical supplies. This project is in its end stage and will soon be completed.

**Stock Care Hall of Fame** Primary annual fundraiser, held at the Ocean Center during Speed Weeks honoring a race car driver each year as an inductee into the "Hall of Fame". The club portion of receipts support our various projects.

<u>In Addition</u> Daytona BeachWest supports a number of Rotary initiatives including Rotary High School age exchange students, Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA), Scholars in higher education, Vocational Exchange teams and more.

<u>Polio Eradication</u> – Rotary has played a lead role in the world wide eradication of Polio and continues to do so. In conjunction with the World Health Organization and in partnership with the Gates Foundation, it is a major emphasis of Daytona Beach West and Rotary International.

<u>Family Renew</u> a provider of transitional housing for homeless families with children, we help by providing playground equipment and general maintenance via club social/work days.

<u>Habitat for Humanity</u> Halifax Habitat for Humanity Veterans Build for a wounded Veteran. Sponsored by the Rotary Club of Daytona Beach West in partnership with Florida Power & Light and the Rotary Club of Daytona Beach.


Other fees from time to time are voted on and billed for the betterment of the club, its projects or social events. At no time to date have they met or exceeded a single quarter total in an entire year.

- 2. Following the 45<sup>th</sup> day a reminder of payment shall be sent from the Club Treasurer and a \$25.00 late fee shall be incurred.
- 3. Following 60 days if no arrangements have been made the member in question shall be terminated from the club roster
- 4. A final billing of any and all monies owed shall be mailed to the former member.

If following the above listed actions the former member wishes to join the Rotary Club of Daytona Beach West, or any other Rotary Club they shall be welcomed upon approval of a membership application and the payment of any arrearages.
