Conclusion: Emphasizes major theme in the speech leaving the									
audience with a clear, concise message or point of application.

Clear enunciation of words. Limited use of unnecessary expressions.									
(I.e.: "uh, you know, O.K.")

Good vocal projection, voice expressiveness, tone and pace.									
<b>10 Points:</b>									
Good eye contact and rapport with the audience.									
<b>10 Points:</b>									
Relaxed yet commanding use of posture and gestures.

Ability to captivate and/or move the audience.
