THE NEW ETHELBERT B. CRAWFORD LIBRARY BUILDING & THE MICKEY MOUSE PROJECT

Mary Paige Lang-Clouse, Library Director at the Ethelbert B. Crawford Library in Monticello and Tara Buckstad-Russo coordinator of the (Mickey Mouse Clock Restoration Project) were the guest speakers at this week's meeting.

Tara began the evening's presentation by giving some background history on the 8' tall, two – sided Mickey Mouse clock that used to hang on the front of the Rhulen building on Broadway for many years. The clock was placed there in 1951 and Mickey Mouse was later added in 1966. Anyone who lived in Monticello during the fifties and sixties should remember the clock. It is still a wonderful childhood memory for many. The clock was taken down from the Rhulen building in 1978 when the building was "refaced". The clock was then donated to the Sullivan County Historical Society where it hung on the back of that building in Hurleyville until last year. It was then relocated to Tara's parent's backyard so that restoration of the clock could begin. The clock-works need to be replaced and the metal sheeting on the side, but the ceramic clock faces are in good condition. The original Mickeys didn't last, but new ones have been made and will be placed back up on the clock. Pictures that showed the clock over the years were passed around to the members at the meeting.

The Crawford library has be agreed to take the clock and mount it on a pole in the new garden area that will be next to the new library building. There will also be a plaque discribing the history of the clock. Tara, Jane Benmoshe, and Gordon McAdams have begun a fundraising effort for the clock in order get the inner workings replaced, help the library offset the cost of installing the pole, and also contribute to what will be the new garden area.

Mary Paige Lang-Clouse, Director of the Ethelbert B. Crawford Memorial Library for the past two years, outlined the plans for the library that will soon be relocated in the newly renovated former Cohen's Bakery building in downtown Broadway. Mary Paige said that the library will be closed from September 26th until mid -October during the move. They wanted to perform the move "before the snow flies". The formal ribbon cutting ceremony will be held on October 18th. You can get a sneak preview of the library on Oct 7 if you have a "Friend of the Library" membership. One of the goals of the library is to create a comfortable garden setting in the area between the new library and the Bagel Bakery building where anyone can come to sit and read a book, eat lunch, or just relax. Mary Paige passed around a drawing of one possible landscaping layout, but she stressed that it was not the final one and other ideas and designs are being entertained. It is part of an overall effort to bring people back to Broadway; sort of like it was in the old days.

There were lots of happy dollars for our guest speakers.
