Program: Ira Immanuel guest of Rob Magrino-The Shops at Nanuet What's going on? We are all dying to know.

The Club was treated to a sneak preview of all that is planned for the new outdoor extravaganza replacing the Nanuet Mall. Simon Properties, the largest operator of malls across the US including Woodbury Commons, has great plans for the 60 acre parcel which will house 758,000 square feet of retail stores, slightly smaller than the current footprint. Macy's and Sears, who own their own properties, will remain with major facelifts. Ira, under a strict vow of silence, could not reveal all of the tenants but could divulge that upscale Fairway Grocery and 12 screen Regal Cinema would be part of the mix. Total cost is a mere \$100 million, "hey that's cheap" says Jay (and we trust his judgment), same traffic pattern. Ira explained





that they have plans to deal with cold weather and an outdoor mall but points out the energy savings of not heating and cooling the common areas like an indoor mall. 50 to 60 stores will make up the new center plus the Macy's and Sears anchors. Yes Andy, Banchetto Feast, (glad to see you back with that new hip), will be there but at a new location facing Middletown Road.
