President Larry brought the meeting to order.



Program- Doreen brought guest Speaker Mike Foreman to scare us to death about



identity theft. Two years ago it was expected that 2 out of 3 will have their identities stolen. Now everyone should expect it to happen at least once in their lifetime. It takes about 600 hours of work to recover from identity theft. 7,000 children had their social security numbers stolen before they were even born. Yes, they were assigned SS#'s that had already been compromised. Identity crooks have a myriad of ways to steal your personal information. Mike said that someone can just walk past you, like at an airport, and scan information off of the cards you are carrying in your pocket. He suggests wallets with RFID sleeves to shield the cards. Phishing schemes get you to respond to bogus emails and divulge information. Don't believe the name you see in the address "from" field. Hover your mouse pointer over it to reveal the real address, look for HTTPS (especially the "s") for secure sites. Skip any links to your bank or financial site found in email and log in directly instead. If your ID has been stolen you may not find out until you are arrested for something the crook did using your identity. "Guilty until proven innocent" is what you will face warns Mike.

Four Way Test- OK for the life of me I cannot recall who did the Four Way Test. Making it even worse, I was the one who asked them to do it. Suffice to say, that Rotarian did a masterful job and truly inspired the Club to follow those ideals until we
