Our speaker today, Dr. Rakesh Shreedhar a surgeon at Good Samaritan Hospital, was introduced by Raj. Dr. Shreedhar described a peoples movement in India called Ekal Vidyalaya. Ekal operates over 51,000 single teacher schools providing education to over 1.3 million students in rural and tribal villages across India. Since 1986, Ekal one-teacher schools have provided basic reading, writing, math, and phys. Ed. Up to third grade. Teachers are local youth specially trained by Ekal. The Ekal Movement helps unite villagers, spark passion for learning among tribal children, curb social evils, and empower villagers to become more self-reliant. Because local resources are used at each school the cost to operate for a year is \$365.00. Ekal has experienced tremendous success since its beginning with 90% of the students continuing their education thru college.
