PROGRAM: Robin Posnack, Ed F.'s "adopted" daughter, spoke to us about a


little-known genetic disease, Familial Dysautonomia. FD affects primarily people of Jewish descent (although it has been traced back to Irish roots) and compromises the autonomic and sensory nervous systems. People with FD do not feel pain, have poor growth, and experience a wide variety of compromising health issues. There are currently 350 cases of FD in the world, with over a dozen in Rockland, Westchester, and NYC, including Robin's second son, Jack. When she was pregnant, Robin was tested for all of the genetic diseases for which there were tests available at that time.

She explained to us how the medical profession consistently makes new tests available unbeknownst to expecting mothers who believe after they have been tested once, that they are in the clear. She also explained that both parents

have to be FD carriers for the child to be at risk, and that when they are, there is a 25% chance the child will be born with FD. Thankfully, there is now a genetic procedure that can reduce that risk, but parents need to know about the tests and the procedure, and many do not. The good news is that Robin's son, Jack, who doctors thought would not make it past his fifth birthday, is now nine years old and doing well. While FD patients and their families are still waiting for a cure, they continue to work on making every day a happy one.

Ed F. footnoted to us how Jack typically spends at least two months each year in the hospital for various ailments. He praised Robin for the





care, love and attention she gives to Jack, her other three children, and the community at large about FD. Thank you, Robin, for an enlightening program!
