PROGRAM: After considering a wide cadre of topics on which to speak, Anjan decided to share his personal experience as a Rotarian participating in international service projects. Anjan joined the New City Rotary Club years after Jaya had joined our club with what he now describes as a limited awareness of all that Rotary does. Eight years ago when traveling to their home in India, they were approached by PDG Bunnee Webb who encouraged them to contact the district governor in their town of Pune. They did and quickly learned of the many opportunities Rotarians have to make a difference for those less fortunate than us. Providing clean water and educational opportunity, especially for women, rose to the forefront for Anjan. He went on to share a number of different projects in which he, Jaya, the New City Rotary and the Pearl River Rotary have been involved in. For example, a joint project between the two clubs supported by district funding brought clean water to 2500 students in India. Another project he and Jaya support is a school for girls with hearing and vision loss whose families would not be able to provide for them otherwise. Because of the dollar-rupee exchange rate, a donation goes very far in India. Anjan also shared some unfortunate experiences where organizations were not able to account for how donations were used and how he now seeks assurance of accountability before participating. Thank you, Anjan, once again for opening our eyes, hearts and minds.
