THE PROGRAM

Expertly and movingly presented by Ruth Bowles to fill us in on the mission and work of the Rockland Council on Alcohol and other Drug Dependency, Inc.

She explained the mission is to increase awareness, to minimize stigma, and to facilitate the distribution on information and referral for help and support to those struggling with alcohol and/or drugs.

She explained that the science proves that addiction is not just a matter of will power, but is actually a chronic, recurring brain disorder requiring treatment and support.....including an emphasis on fitness, nutrition, healthy sleep patterns and reduced stress.

Specific to the opioid crisis, Ruth explained that even a week's dosage of some of the most powerful prescription pain meds can be physically addictive to the point of withdrawal symptoms....and certainly not appropriate for minor procedures like dental extractions......for which they are sometimes prescribed.

She told us there were 40 OD deaths in the County last year.....but that on the positive side Senator Carlucci had successfully obtained funding for two recovery coaches who actually meet patients leaving rehab to begin the process of longer term support.

Ruth candidly described alcohol and drug recovery this way: "Most don't make it....Some of us do."
