Happy Bucks: Happy Birthday Dollars, Happy to be here Bucks, many pesos for all the special injury recoveries, Bucks for the coming Holiday Weekend, and Prayer Dollars for our Armed Services.

The Program: Brought to us by Rob Magrino, <u>Mr. Jay Flaherty</u> from Division 30, in the New York Field Division, from the Drug Enforcement Administration under the Department of Justice.

Mr. Flaherty spoke to the club on the latest epidemic of addiction to prescription drugs and the reemergence of the use of heroin as a growing problem of drug addiction. The local youth are now always taught to be aware of possible drug presence in their neighborhoods. In addition to the youth awareness, the parents should especially be advised to watch for the potential warning signs of addiction. Parents need to be vigilant regarding their children in noticing mood swings, depression, and attitude changes which can be the 1<sup>st</sup> signs of substance abuse. Medicine cabinet prescription pain pills and its over- use can lead to an intensive even accidental drug addiction.

A common pain prescription medicine called oxycodone, which itself outside of a doctors' prescription is very expensive on the Black underground Market. That particular drug choice being expensive has produced the rebirth of heroin, which has become the drug of choice because it is inexpensive cost factor. The primary use of the pill oxycodone form is to crush it and snort the residue compared to the longer activating full pill form. The cheaper cost of new heroin is \$6.00 per bag that produces 15 hits with the drug being purer than ever before
