

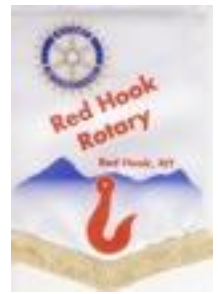

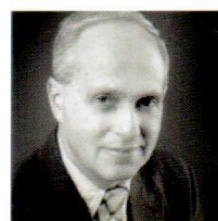
Rotary

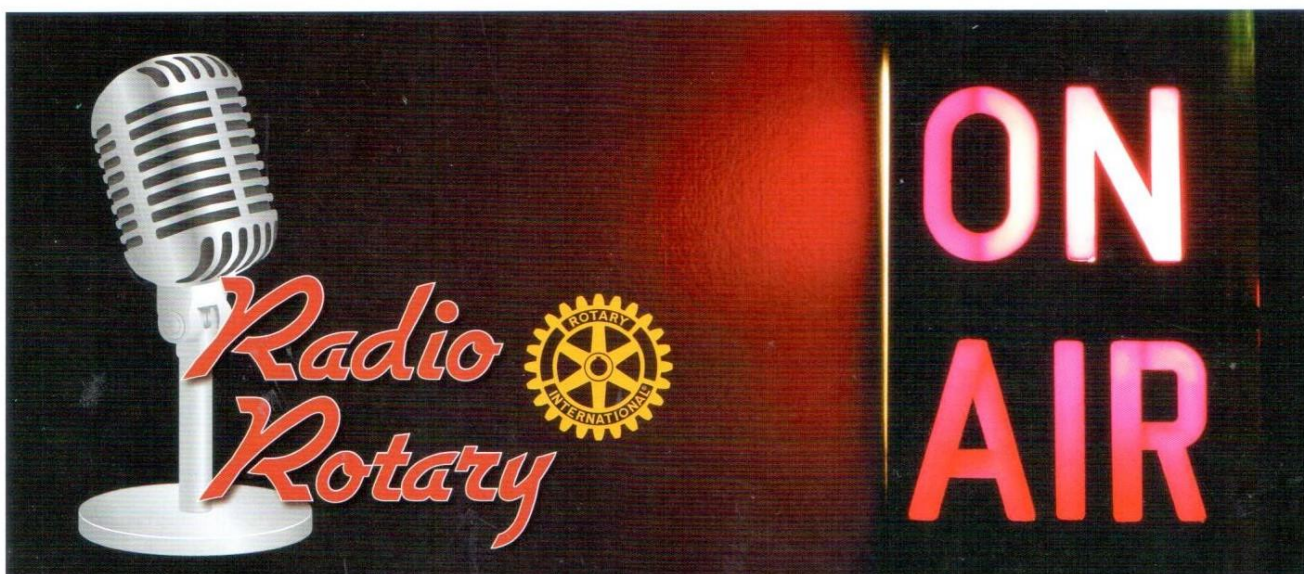
Guests' stories about their humanitarian work are uplifting, showing how caring people strive to do good in the world.
