Wallkill East Rotary's Service Highlights

- Scholarships—Each year, two \$2,500 scholarships are awarded to two high school seniors who are Town of Wallkill residents.
- Wiffle for Kids—This event raised over \$12,000 each year for local youth programs at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Town of Wallkill, Pine Bush and Sullivan County and the YMCA of Middletown, Sullivan County, and Monroe as well as our club's scholarship foundation.
- Dictionary Project—Distribute dictionaries to third graders in the Pine Bush Central School District and two

schools in the Middletown district.
