SS Point West Voyage Log

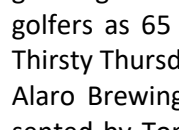

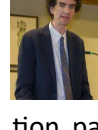

First Amendment cases. Kathy Copeland, Bruce Levering and President Roger gave

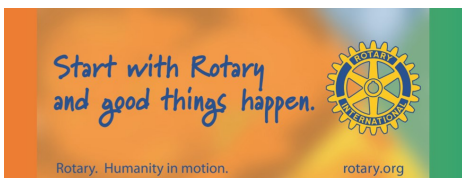
