Carol Van Bruggen brought the club up-todate on the school PWR helped develop and open in Uvoba. Zambia back in 2012. Carol also helped establish the Rotary Club of Mfuwi, which is the local Rotary support for the school. The school has a PWR plaque on it and the students are very aware of Rotary's help and involvement. Through the work Rotarians did to build up the school they were able to get support from the government who now provides government teachers. Desiree Wilson, Trish Harrington, Kathleen McNabb, Mary Lyn Kagan and other PWR members have taken the Africa trip and have seen the school, met the students. teachers, and Rotarians involved.

PDG Bob Deering and his wife have even hosted a student through college. Carol's nonprofit the Africa Hope Fund now supports Uyoba and 4 other schools and libraries and pays the salaries of over 20 reading assistants at the libraries at each school.

The most recent building completed is the school Library at Uyoba which is very important to the students' learning. Carol said the students love the library and spend as much time there as possible reading.

The Mfuwi Club has also been involved locally by providing food, putting in hand washing and disinfection stations throughout local shopping areas. There is no local hospital, so they are being very careful.
