Over the globe half of the hospital beds are filled by patients suffering



from waterborne diseases. More than a billion people don't have access to clean

drinking water. Clean water, better sanitation, teacher training, and hygiene education in schools can im-

prove the health and I education of children by creating a cycle of opportunity, increas-



ing school attendance, and improving academic performance. With one focus on providing clean water, RI has developed Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) Global Grant Projects, and has invested in over \$130 million in over 2000 projects worldwide since 2013. Rotary Club members unite to create a world where water, sanitation, and hygiene are cornerstones of self-confidence and dignity. This is not only in more impoverished countries but in the Untied States; about 30% of people in the Navaho Nation had to haul the water they need as there has been no access to local running water. Rotary clubs from Baja California, Mexico and Sedona, AZ worked together for a global grant to install water systems to over 50 homes. Local efforts by the area Rotarians

can have a great impact in those areas and together we can impact the whole
