

HEILMAN SCHOLARSHIP

Honoring the Legacy of Guy Heilman

The Heilman Scholarship, established by the Rotary Club of Point West - Sacramento (PWR), is dedicated to the memory of Guy Heilman, a cherished club member and song leader. This scholarship is made possible through generous donations from Mr. Heilman's family, PWR members, and the Rotary Club Fundraisers.

Scholarship Details

- Available to graduating seniors pursuing higher education at a trade/technical school, 2-year college, or 4-year college.
- Open to students interested in trade fields (e.g., automotive, construction, dental/medical, police/fire) as well as traditional academic paths.
- Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and plan to further their education past high school.
- Scholarship funds will be paid in August for the first semester of the student's first year, directly to the college/school.
- Students must submit an invoice to PWR for the scholarship payment, including the scholarship award amount, student ID number, and college/school information.

Eligibility Requirements

- Children and grandchildren of Rotary members are NOT eligible.
- Applicants must have a Social Security Number or Tax ID (only required if selected as a recipient).
- Must provide a working email address and a separate email for a parent/quardian.
- Must inform their parent/guardian of the application, as they will receive an email to endorse it.
- Must secure a Letter of Recommendation from a school official (e.g., teacher, counselor, or principal). Additional optional letters may come from a coach or mentor from an out-of-school program.
- Once submitted, applications cannot be changed.
- Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.



Application Requirements

Applicants must submit

1. A list of:

- School activities (student government, sports, publications, schoolsponsored community service, student-faculty committees, art, music, etc.).
- Public service and community activities (e.g., homeless services, environmental protection, advocacy, church involvement).
- Part-time and full-time jobs held.
- o Awards, scholarships, and special recognitions received or applied for.

2. Essay Responses:

- o How volunteer or community service has shaped them.
- A specific example of leadership.
- o The three most significant courses taken in preparation for their career.
- What they plan to do with their education.
- (250-500 words) explaining why they chose their college/school, why they deserve the scholarship, and what contributions they plan to make in their field.
- 3. Statement of Accuracy signed by the applicant.
- 4. Endorsement from a teacher, counselor, or principal

Deadline

May 1st (Each Year) – Late applications will NOT be accepted.
