Presenter: Dr. Bob Davidson, Rotarian Topic: Meaning and Origins of Common Phrases

Volunteers needed for Canstruction: March 22, 2025

Canstruction is an annual event where groups across the Oneonta community get together to build a structure entirely out of cans. Each group is responsible for funding the structure, deciding the design and composition of the structure, and building the structure. The build will take place in the Southside Mall on March 22nd, and the cans will remain on display in the mall until March 30th. The best structures will win a Canstruction trophy! This is a great way to advertise, team build, and help the community all at once. Last year, 7,266 pounds of food were donated to our local food pantries, making a grand total of 57,266 pounds of food so far! The distribution of food to local pantries is coordinated by the Hunger Coalition of Otsego County (HCOC). Visit <u>https://www.canstruction.org/</u> cansculpture to see examples of structures. (Ours will be a bit more modest.) Much of the planning for Canstruction was done in 2020 but was shelved when the pandemic forced the cancellation of the project. Kathy Leahy and Vicki Rickard have agreed to continue their leadership on this project. We need people to help plan, shop and then build the structure. We also hope to partner with another group.
