#### **Rotary information from Cynthia**

Rotary Theme for April is "Maternal and Child Health Month.. Cynthia presented a power point covering work of Rotary under the Maternal and Child Health theme. She noted 99 percent of maternal deaths occur in developing countries. Rotary has a number of projects dedicated to combating this epidemic. For example, a medical camp has been set up in Sri Lanka, home of last year's Rotary International president. Among the Clubs contributing to the project has been the Rotary Club of Newtown

#### One guest today

Past President Jane Williams was the greeter. Jane's guest, Ann Conroy, had a mini-presentation about First Place on Sheas Terrace in Ardmore. First Place is dedicated to providing refugees emergency housing. Sanctioned refugees from troubled countries are provided a flat \$925 when they arrive and then expected to find jobs and housing despite likely, language and cultural barriers. Ann educated us in hopes that the Ardmore Rotary may support this locally-based cause which helps immigrants adjust and thrive in the U.S The project is co-sponsored by Ardmore Presbyterian and St. George's Episcopal Churches. Anne Conroy, a member of the First Place Task Force, appealed to Ardmore Rotary and the community to help with cost of the lease.

#### Today's program

Our speaker today was Dr Jack Guttentag, professor emeritus and former professor of finance at Penn. His topic was Reverse Mortgages. He believes this is an important instrument to help retirees who are struggling in the U.S. He pointed out people are retiring with inadequate pensions and savings to

compensate for increased longevity.

The Home Equity Conversion Mortgage (**HECM**) is Federal Housing Administration's (FHA) reverse mortgage program which enables homeowners over 62 to withdraw up to 70 percent of the equity in their home. You choose how you want to withdraw your funds, whether in a fixed monthly amount or a line of credit or a combination of both.

Based on his data, Professor Guttentag said the reverse mortgage vehicle is "vastly underutilized." He said there should be upwards of one million reverse mortgages, but there are only 60,000 active

loans today. He said the g Government will pick up left over mortgage if your home devalues below the reverse mortgage amount; income from the mortgage is not taxable; it is a system to allow seniors to stay in their home; you can receive a lump sum or a set amount each month; Professor Guttentag wrapped up the presentation with an invitation to visit his website which he established to help seniors who are looking into reverse mortgages and have questions. They will need transportation from JFK to Philly. They may also need a variety of transportation around the area while here. Then they will need transportation back to NY-JFK Airport

#### **SCHEDULE**

May 19 (Friday): Arrive in JFK (time to be determined) and travel by shuttle to Philadelphia

May 21 (Sunday): Admitted to Hospital

May 22 (Monday): Megan's Surgery

May 29 (Monday): Megan Discharged from Hospital for recuperation period (discharge date tentative- sometime between May 29 and June 4)

June 20 (Tuesday): Recuperating and return to New York and fly home (tentative)

#### HOUSING

Housing is a bit of a "quandary". The Ronald McDonald House (RMH) will only house the family while Megan is in the hospital.

#### Possible housing options are:

- 1. Ideally it would be wonderful if a super "Service Above Self" Rotarian near Shriners Hospital could house the family, provide meals and transportation during their entire stay. Do you know of anyone?
- 2. Same as Option 1, but a few people split up their stay for one or two weeks at a time.
- 3. Find inexpensive hotel options near the hospital and use Uber for transportation around the area. Obviously, this can get expensive.
